FRUIT

4-IN-1

The 4-in-1 Apple Tree is a uniquely budded combination tree that offers four of the following choice moderate-chill varieties of Gala, Fuji, Golden Delicious and Red Delicious into one outstanding apple tree. These are select varieties for moderate winter climate or colder areas that receive over 500 chilling hours. Grows 10-15' tall with an 8-10' spread. This apple cocktail tree will render its delicious ripened fruits from late August to early October. Full sun Zone 5 - 8



APPLE, FUJI

Nicely rounded apples are a big handful of good eating: the dense, creamy-white flesh has a marvelous texture. A very sweet, low-acid apple with complex overtones of fresh citrus and honey. The skin is rich red, with small splashes of yellow-gold and light striping. Your tree matures **approximately 12 - 15' tall x 12 - 15' wide.** Great for fresheating and cooking. Ripens in September. Semi-dwarf. Best pollinators: Granny Smith, GrandGala™ or Lodi. Full sun Zone 4-8



APPLE, GALA

Fruit is delectably sweet-tart, which makes it a great fresh-eating apple. In addition, it cooks and stores well, so plan to make this your go-to cooking and canning apple. When your tree matures, it will be approximately 12 - 18' tall x 12 - 18' wide. Ripens in early October. Semi-dwarf. Best pollinators: Super Red Fuji, BraeStar or any Golden Delicious. Full sun Zone 5-8



APPLE, GRANNY SMITH

This classic favorite features a crisp bite and sweet-tart flavor. Tip-bearing tree yields a familiar green fruit perfect for fresh-eating, baking, and making cider. When your tree matures, it will be **approximately 8 - 10' tall x 8 - 10' wide.** Fruit keeps up to six months in proper storage. Heat-tolerant. Ripens in late October. Semi-dwarf. Pollinator required: Red Delicious, Red Rome Beauty, or Golden Delicious. Full sun Zone 5-8



APPLE, HONEYCRISP

Fruit is aromatic and sweet as honey with an explosively juicy, crisp texture. Grow this naturally compact tree even in small spaces. **Grows 12-15' tall and wide.** Cold-hardy. Ripens in early September. Semidwarf. Pollinator required: Choose another early or mid-blooming apple variety, like Red Rome Beauty, Jon-A-Red Jonathan, or any Golden Delicious. Full sun Zone 3-6



APPLE, JONATHON

These medium-sized, round apples have such a compelling sweet-tart taste that they are now one of the most commercially-produced apples in the United States. Perfect for pie. Fruit features a bright red color and a classic Jonathan sweet-tart taste. Make flavor-filled pies, cider and old-fashioned candied apples. Ripens in mid-September. **12-15 feet tall and wide.** Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 5-8



APPLE, LIBERTY

Tree is low-maintenance due to its resistance to apple scab, cedar apple rust, fire blight, and powdery mildew. Fruit has a yellow background with attractive red overtones, a crisp white flesh, and a harmonious sweet-tart taste. Perfect for fresh-eating, cooking, canning, or keeping. Cold-hardy. **Matures to be about 12-15' tall and wide.** Ripens in early September. Best pollinators: Cortland, Freedom, or Ultra Mac. Full sun Zone 4-7



APPLE, MCINTOSH

Moderately large fruit with an appetizing apple aroma. Tree is a vigorous grower and a precocious bearer. Fruit is vibrant-red, thin, and peels easily and flesh is tender with a sprightly sweet-tart taste. Good keeper in proper storage. Cold-hardy. **Matures to be about 12-15' tall and wide.** Ripens in August. Best pollinators: Cortland, Brae Star or Lodi. Full sun Zone 4-8



APPLE, RED DELICIOUS

Many orchards plant this spur-type tree because of its highly productive nature — it produces bushel after bushel of picture-perfect 4" red apples. Cold-hardy. **Matures to be about 12-15' tall and wide.** Ripens in late September. Best pollinators: Jon-A-Red Jonathan, Red Rome Beauty or any Golden Delicious. Full sun Zone 4-8



APPLE, RED JONAGOLD

Unique flavor makes the fruit luscious enough to serve by itself as dessert. This crisp super apple is a cross between the tart Jonathan and the sweet Golden Delicious. The result is a tasty treat for all! **Matures to be about 12-15' tall and wide.** Ripens in mid-September. Best pollinators: Jon-A-Red Jonathan or any Golden Delicious. Full sun Zone 5-8



REACHABLE APPLES

BAKERS DELIGHT

A rich complexed flavor that is great for baking. Red, medium sized fruit that will mature in early to mid-September. Great for containers. **Grows to be 6-8' tall with a 12-15' spread.** Pollinate with a Crunch A Munch.



CRUNCH A MUNCH

Sweet-tart taste with hints of tropical flavors! Crunchy texture that is perfect for snacking, baking and for making cider as well. Winner of multiple blind taste tests. **Grows 6-8' tall with a spread of 12-15'.** Pollinate with a Bakers Delight. Full sun Zone 5-8



PIXIE CRUNCH

Crisp with mouthwatering sweet flavor and juiciness. Sweeter than a Honeycrisp and easier to grow! Handles late frost better than other varieties. Matures late August and grows **approximately 6-8' tall with a spread of 10'.** Pollinate with a red delicious, gala or liberty. Full sun Zone 5-8



BLACKBERRY, ARAPAHO

The Arapaho blackberry is an erect, early-ripening, thornless shrub that produces large red and black fruit. The berries are firm and tasty with small seeds — good for making jams and syrups. The Arapaho blackberry grows to a height of 4–6' and a spread of around 4' at maturity. Full to part sun Zone 4



BLACKBERRY, TRIP. CROWN

A unique flavor that has garnered rave reviews! This productive plant yields berries that offer a tasty blend of sweetness and tartness. The fruit is borne uniformly, so it is easy to pick. Grows 4-5' tall and 3-4' wide. Heat-tolerant. Ripens in early August. Self-pollinating. Zone 5-9



BLUEBERRY, JELLY BEAN

Jelly Bean® has large, flavorful blueberries that taste like sweet homemade blueberry jelly. Moderate growing; reaches only 1 to 2 ft. tall and wide. The foliage has unique, elongated green leaves with highlights of red in cooler climates. Try a mini-hedge along a pathway, in the landscape or in decorative patio containers. Deciduous. Sun to part sun Zone 4



BLUEBERRY, PINK LEMONADE Pinkish white flowers produce pale greenish fruit that ripens to an astonishing deep pink color. Moderate grower to 4-5 ft. tall and 5 ft. wide. All the antioxidants of its blue cousins but in an incredible new color. In the Fall, the leaves turn golden yellow to brilliant orange. Pleasant flavored, glossy fruit that ripens in mid-late season. High-bush variety. Full to part sun Zone 4



BLUEBERRY, RAZZ

Fat, juicy berries are a pretty periwinkle blue and are simply splendid for fresh eating. It's one of our favorites for its distinctly raspberry-flavored notes. **Grows 4' tall with a 3' spread.** Razz also takes well to baking and preserves. Also an extremely attractive landscape plant, with a flaming foliage show in the fall. A true winner for farmer's markets and U-Pick farms. Disease-resistant. Ripens in July. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 4



BLUEBERRY, SUNSHINE BLUE

One of the best for mild-winter areas, a low-chill selection perfect for small gardens or large patio tubs. Blue-green foliage and showy pink to white flowers provide ornamental value, followed by an abundant crop of fruit. Moderate growing, semi-dwarf shrub; reaches 3 to 4 ft. tall and wide. Self-fruiting, but yields best when planted with another variety. Recommended winter chill: 150 hours. Deciduous. Full sun Zone 5



BLUEBERRY, SWEETHEART

This vigorous Northern-Southern cross produces a heavy crop of sweet, juicy, berries early in the blueberry season — and, in mild areas, a lighter second crop develops later that same year. When your plant matures, it will be approximately 5 - 6' tall x 3 - 4' wide. Yields up to 15 pounds per plant. Cold-hardy. First crop ripens in late May to early June. Second crop ripens in August. Self-pollinating. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CHERRY, JULIET

Juliet's cherries with rich, complex flavor are a favorite for eating fresh, but are delicious when used for baking, jams and ice cream, and freeze beautifully. **Growing just 5-to 8- ft. tall,** Juliet is a breeze to care for and harvest, yet still yields up to 30 lbs. of fruit. Plants are attractive incorporated into the landscape or planted in large containers. Abundant, white flowers, glossy green foliage and attractive bush habit allow it to double as an ornamental. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 2-7



CHERRY, MONTMORENCY

The Montmorency Cherry Tree produces the United States most popular sour cherry. It is considered the very best cherry for making pies. This highly prized cherry tree will welcome spring with brilliant, snow-white flowers in spring followed by a great number of clusters of red sour cherries in July. **Matures to be about 12-18' tall and wide.**

Full sun Zone 4-8



CHERRY, RAINIER

Rainier Cherry is an outstanding sweet cherry tree that produces large, delicious yellow fruit with a beautiful dark red blush. Semi-dwarf, **grows to 15-25' tall with a 12-18' spread.** It's an easy to grow, low maintenance backyard variety that was originally produced by crossing the popular Bing red cherry with the age-old favorite, Van red cherry. This cherry tree needs a pollinator. Best to fit is a Van or Sweetheart cherry. Full sun Zone 5-9



CHERRY, ROMEO

Fall in love with this variety that's known for its cold hardiness and sweetness! This handsome, self-pollinating tree produces up to 30 pounds of deep crimson cherries. **Growing just 6-8' tall.** The sweet fruit has a high flesh-to-pit ratio and doesn't split. Excellent for making juice, canning, baking, and, of course, eating fresh. Full sun Zone 2-7



CHERRY, STELLA

The Stella cherry is self-fruitful - no pollinizer needed. It has a large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry. Expect a later harvest with the Stella cherry. It will pollinate with the Bing cherry tree (for more fruit), except in mild winter climates. The flesh is also black in color. It is an excellent cherry for fresh eating. It is also resistant to cracking. Tree bears at a young age. **Tree eventually reaches 15 to 16 feet tall.** Full sun Zone 4-8



CHERRY, VAN

Irresistible, ruby-red cherries! Tree is vigorous and bears young. Fruit is medium-large and firm with flavor similar to Bing. Short-stemmed fruit grows in a cylinder around the branch. When your semi-dwarf tree matures, it will be **approximately** 15 - 18' tall x 15 - 18' wide. Enjoy magnificent cherry blossoms in spring! Resists cracking. Ripens in mid June. Pollinator required: Choose any other sweet cherry variety. Full sun Zone 5-8



PAW PAW, MITCHELL

This is a highly regarded variety with large round to oval fruit. Excellent flavor. Ripens in mid to late September. Paw paws are the largest native North American fruit tree. For proper pollination, plant another pawpaw variety. **Can grow to 25' tall.** Full sun Zone 5



PEACH, CONTENDER

Grow peaches in regions where temperatures fall well below zero. This exceptionally hardy variety, perfect for northern gardens, consistently yields large crops of sweet, juicy, medium-to-large fruit. Also features lovely pink flowers that bloom and attract bees in spring. Disease-resistant to bacterial spot. Cold-hardy. Freestone. Ripens in mid to late August. 8 - 10' tall x 8 - 10' wide. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 4-8



PEACH, ELBERTA

A famed peach for canning. Tree bears crops of large, attractive yellow fruit with a splash of crimson. Juicy, evenly yellow flesh is great for fresh-eating as well as freezing and canning for extended enjoyment. When your tree matures, it will be approximately 12 - 15' tall x 12 - 15' wide. Ripens in September. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 5-8



PEACH, RED HAVEN

A blue-ribbon, all-purpose peach. Luscious, top-quality fruit is great as a fresh snack or for canning and freezing. Enjoy bushels of large peaches with almost fuzzless skin over firm, creamy textured yellow flesh. Tree is heavy-bearing and easy to grow and maintain. Blooms late to avoid spring frosts. Branches have a spreading nature. When your tree matures, it will be approximately 12 - 15' tall x 12 - 15' wide. Disease-resistant to leaf spot. Freestone. Ripens in late July. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 5-8



PEACH, RELIANCE

Our hardiest peach tree. This tree produces a heavy crop of fruit as far north as Canada, even after frigid winters. Perfect for northern fruit gardens! Fruit is medium-to-large with a sweet, peachy flavor. When your tree matures, it will be approximately 12 - 15' tall x 12 - 15' wide. Features a flush of pink flowers in spring. Cold-hardy. Freestone. Ripens in July. Self-pollinating. Full sun Zone 4-8



PEAR, BARTLETT

Bartlett pear trees are fast-growing, fruit-producing trees that reach heights of 20 feet with an equal spread. Like other fruit trees, they need good soil drainage with plenty of water the first few years. They bloom early in the season and the fruit is ready to harvest in late summer or early fall. Full sun Zone 5



PEAR, CLAPPS FAVORITE

Vigorous tree has an upright growth habit **18 - 20' Tall X 12 - 13' Wide** and produces large, sun-yellow pears with a red cheek. Fruit is juicy with a fine sweet texture, ideal for fresh-eating and canning. Harvest a week or two before Bartlett. Harvest in late August. Full sun Zone 5



PEAR, D'ANJOU

Still tasty seven months later. This pear hits all the right notes. It's cold-hardy, vigorous and precocious... and its keeping quality is unparalleled at up to seven months. Bright green and very firm at harvest, with a tinge of yellow as it ripens. **18 - 20' Tall X 12 - 13' Wide.** Subtly sweet, fine-textured flesh. Harvest in late September. Best pollinators: Bartlett, Beurre Bosc. Full sun Zone 5



PEAR, KIEFFER

The fast growing Kieffer reaches a mature **height of 15-25 feet quickly**. It's rounded habit and glossy green leaves make it exceptional as a landscape tree, as well as for producing flavorful fruit. It is known for its hardiness and long life span, tolerating hot climates and drought. Sun Zone 4



PEAR, LUSCIOUS

The Luscious Pear produces a medium to small bright yellow pear with a beautiful red blush. The fruit is very juicy, and deliciously sweet. A very vigorous grower, it will mature at a **height of 20-25 feet.** It is considered a mid-sized tree that will really reward you when planted in full sun. It also prefers well drained soil. Your Luscious Pear is fireblight resistant and extremely hardy, as low as minus 50 degrees. Zone 4-8



RASPBERRY, SHORTCAKE

Compact and thornless! Harvest light red berries with ease. Fruit flavor is sweet with a vanilla essence. When your plant matures, it will be approximately 2 - 3' tall x 2 - 3' wide. No need to trellis or stake this plant. Sturdy canes give an appealing natural mound shape. Ripens in late June early July. Self-pollinating Full sun Zone 5-9



RASPBERRY, FALL GOLD

A rare, exciting self-fertile gold raspberry with the same deliciously sweet taste of red varieties, and the ability to produce two crops each season. **Moderate growing; reaches up to 4 ft. tall, 3 ft. wide.** After a late summer to fall harvest, a second crop arrives the following spring on the same canes. Excellent fresh or for preserves and pies. The warm yellow berries brighten the garden. Deciduous. **Full sun Zone 3-8**
