HYDRANGEA

ALICE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) A superior selection of Oakleaf Hydrangea that branches well and produces a full, rounded, and large shrub that bears white flower spikes aging to a lovely rose-pink as they mature. Stunning burgundy-red fall color and peeling cinnamon bark make this an outstanding year-round shrub. Matures at 8 to 12 feet tall and wide. Full sun to part shade Zone 5




BLOOMSTRUCK

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA MACROPHYLLA) Rose-pink, violet, or blue flowers on red-purple stems with glossy dark green leaves in summer. Extremely strong stems, heat tolerance and great disease resistance, especially to powdery mildew. Grows 3-4' tall and 4-5' wide. Part sun Zone 4



BOBO

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) A delightful plant that is engulfed by large white flowers in summer and turning a pinkish color in fall. The flowers are held upright on strong stems and continue to grow and lengthen as they bloom. **Grows to 3 feet tall and 4 feet wide.** Sun to





DIAMOND ROUGE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) abundant, long lasting flowers on strong stems that start out white and progress to pink, raspberry red and finally wine red. Flowers start blooming in July and take on red coloration earlier in the season than other pink paniculatas. Grows to the height of 4-5' tall with a 3-4' width. Full sun Zone 3-8



END. SUMMER, ORIGINAL

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA MACROPHYLLA) Bright pink/blue, 8 inch mophead inflorescences persist till fall frosts on the original. Blooms are pH specific and recurrent on new wood. Great foliage, stiff stems. **Matures at 3 to 5 feet tall and wide.** Part sun Zone 4



FIRE AND ICE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) A compact, early blooming, heat tolerant selection with attractive greenish-red foliage all season. Blooms open creamy white in early summer, turn pink in mid-summer, becoming deep red in fall. A beautiful accent, foundation or border shrub for the garden. Deciduous. **Reaches 3-4 ft. tall and wide.** Full shade to part sun Zone 3



FIRE LIGHT

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Very hardy hydrangea with upright panicles that are packed with pure white florets in summer that transforms to rich pomegranate-pink by fall. Has thick sturdy stems and grows to 6' tall and wide. Sun Zone 3



INVINCIBELLE RUBY

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA ARBORESCENS) Spectacular, large, full mophead blooms, on sturdy, upright stems. The flower clusters appear on new wood, first as dark burgundy-red buds, then erupt in a dazzling display of two-toned, bright ruby red and silvery pink flowers. The deep, dark green foliage backs these summer gems beautifully. Moderate growing; reaches 3 to 4 ft. tall, 2 to 3 ft. wide. Part sun Zone 3-9



LIL QUICK FIRE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Like Quick Fire, it is early blooming, flowering about a month before other hydrangeas. White flowers transform to pink-red as summer progresses. This dwarf plant fits easily into any landscape, including container gardens. Add it to your existing hydrangea garden to extend the hydrangea season. **Grows 3-5' tall with a 4-7' spread.** Sun to part shade Zone 3-8



LIMELIGHT

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) The bright 6-8 inch lime-green flower heads are held upright on this shrub and are followed in autumn by deep pink blooms. **Mature height is 8' tall and as wide,** but can be pruned to desired height. The autumn display of both blooms on the same plant is exquisite. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



LIMETTA

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA LIMETTA) Rounded flower heads begin vibrant green, lighten to soft greenish-white as they open, and then age to light green again. Lush green foliage remains attractive all season and nicely fills the spaces not covered by flowers. Blooms throughout the summer on new wood so it's practically guaranteed to bloom every year. Compact plants with strong stems. **Grows 2.5' to 3' tall.** Full sun to afternoon shade Zone 3



LITTLE LIME

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) approximately one-third the size of Limelight with the same great features. This dwarf Hydrangea offers more versatility in the landscape. **Grows to 3 to 5 feet tall and wide**. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



MAGICAL FLAME

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Fiery, flame colored blooms on a tough and sturdy plant. Abundant torch-shaped flower clusters flash summer white blooms briefly before turning red as cooler weather starts to set in. This strong, sun-loving Hydrangea turns heads with stunning color until frost. Fast grower, 3-4' tall with a 4-5' spread. Part sun Zone 5-9



MINI MAUVETTE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA ARBORESENS) This tough cutie features dense, round purple-mauve blossoms for months on plants that only grow 2-3' tall and wide. A strong rebloomer, its flowers enchant the garden from summer through fall. Only growing 2-3' high and 3-4' wide makes them perfect for smaller areas. Attractive to butterflies, birds and other pollinators. Part sun Zone 3-8



MUNCHKIN

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) Enjoy a profusion of robust flower clusters that open white and age to pink, remaining upright even after heavy rain. Dark green, deeply lobed oak-like foliage turns brilliant mahogany in fall. Fast growing; reaches 3 ft. to 4 1/2 ft. tall and wide. Compact and well-suited for smaller landscapes, in groups, or as a hedge. Deciduous. Part sun to part shade Zone 5-9



OAKLEAF

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) Blooms in mid-July, flower clusters are erect panicles 4-10 inches high, with sterile outer florets. Leaves about the shape of red oak. White flowers turn pink in August. Grows in sunny and dry conditions, but will also do well in shade. Grows 4-6' tall with a 3-5' spread. Full sun to part shade. Zone 5-9



PEE WEE OAKLEAF

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) A wonderful dwarf Oakleaf Hydrangea that **matures at 3 to 4 feet tall and wide.** Abundant white flower heads appear in early to mid-summer followed by excellent wine-red fall leaf color. A great selection for smaller gardens. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



PHANTOM

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Huge, conical, cream colored panicles appear on this beautiful plant from summer to fall. **Grows to a large, 8' tall if left unpruned.** Shear back in early spring for a more dense growth habit. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



PINKY WINKY

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Large, 12 to 16-inch, two-toned blooms in white and pink. The new flowers are white and occur at the tip of the panicle. Strong stems hold the flowers upright. A beauty against its dark green foliage. **Matures at 6 to 8 feet tall.** Full to part sun Zone 3



QUICK FIRE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) This hardy Hydrangea is early to bloom. The flowers are quick to turn pink and show at least a month before other varieties. Will turn to a dark pink in fall. **Grows 6-8 feet tall and wide.** Sun to part sun Zone 3



RUBY SLIPPERS

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) A compact, shrub with large flowers that start white, fade to pink and then turn to a deep rose. Rich, dark green leaves turn mahogany-red in fall. Reaches 3 to 4 feet tall and 4 to 5 feet wide. Part sun to part shade Zone 5



SIKES DWARF

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) a dwarf mounded cultivar that matures to only **2-3' tall and to 3-4' wide.** Showy, white flowers begin bloom in late spring. Flowers emerge white, gradually fade to light pink and then turn brown by late summer. Deep green, oak-like leaves turn attractive shades of bronze, maroon and purple in autumn. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



SNOW QUEEN

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA) Large, dense 6 to 8 inch long clusters of white flowers are held upright above the dark green oak leafshaped foliage. Flowers become rose-pink in fall and leaves turn deep red-bronze. Tan-brown exfoliating bark is attractive in winter. Moderate growing; reaches 4 to 5 ft. tall, 5 to 6 ft. wide. Part sun Zone 5



STRAWBERRY SUNDAE

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Large flower panicles emerge creamy white in mid-summer, change to pink then strawberry red and last well into fall. A compact variety maturing at 4 to 5 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide. Perfect for a small garden and cut flowers. Sun to part shade Zone 4



TUFF STUFF

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA SERRATA) Lovely reddish-pink lace-cap flowers with semi-double florets open with creamy coloration in the center and age to an intense pink. Blooms prolifically in early summer and reblooms to frost. With amazing hardiness it **reaches 2 to 3 ft. tall and wide.** Full to part sun Zone 5



TWIST N SHOUT

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA MACROPHYLLA) this reblooming lace-cap Hydrangea inherited the best characteristics of both of its parents. Purple lace cap flowers alongside pink overlapping petals bloom in summer. **Matures at 3 to 5 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide.** Part shade Zone 4



VANILLA STRAWBERRY

(LATIN: HYDRANGEA PANICULATA) Large panicles emerge a creamy vanilla-white and mature through soft pink to strawberry red. A beautiful multi-color show. The large blooms are held erect on red stems. This dramatic Hydrangea grows 6 to 7 feet tall and 4 to 5 feet wide. Full sun to part sun Zone 4
