

PERENNIALS

AGASTACHE, ANISE

(LATIN: AGASTACHE FOENICULUM) commonly known as anise hyssop, is an upright, clump-forming perennial of the mint family that is native to parts of the upper Midwest and Great Plains. **It grows to 2-4' tall.** It is noted for its mid- to late summer bloom of lavender to purple flowers and its anise-scented foliage. Flowers are attractive to bees (good nectar plant), hummingbirds and butterflies. Full Sun to part shade Zone 4-8



AJUGA, BURGUNDY GLOW

(LATIN: AJUGA REPTANS) Reddish purple foliage is variegated with white and pink. Fast growing and hardy. **Grows 6" tall** and is used for groundcover. Shade Zone 3-9



ALLIUM, MEDUSA

(LATIN: ALLIUM) an ornamental onion with snaky, twisty leaves that will remind you of the snake hair from the Medusa legend. 'Medusa' forms a low mound of grey-green, narrow foliage with leaves that twist slightly at the end. **Grows 2 feet tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 4



ALLIUM, MILLENIUM

(LATIN: ALLIUM) This easy to grow perennial is perfect for your garden, blooming in July and August with bright, cheerful rosy purple 2" round flowers atop a mound of neat, tidy, bright green strappy foliage that, when crushed, has the fragrance of onions. **Grows to the height of 20" tall.** Deer hate the onion scent. Some designers are using this plant in gardens to keep the deer away from the rest of the plants in the garden. Loves hot dry conditions. Full sun Zone 5-8



AMSONIA, BLUE ICE

(LATIN: AMSONIA) This is an erect, clump-forming plant that features terminal, pyramidal clusters of star-like, dark lavender-blue flowers in late spring atop erect, leafy stems growing to only **15-18" tall.** Narrow, willow-shaped, dark green foliage turns an attractive bright yellow in fall. **Grows 1 to 1.5 ft. tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



ANEMONE, CURTAIN CALL

(LATIN: ANEMONE X HYBRID) Features bright rose pink flowers with a small mound of green foliage. Late season flowering. **Grows to 14-18" tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



ANEMONE, HONOR. JOBERT

(LATIN: ANEMONE X HYBRID) An award-winning perennial with a multitude of pure white flowers on graceful, branching upright stems for five weeks or more, above a solid clump of dark green deeply cut leaves. Lovely massed in a woodland setting or spotted into wild rock gardens. **Slow growing to 2 ft. tall, 5 ft. in bloom; spreads to 2 ft. wide.**
Part sun Zone 4-8



ANEMONE, WHIRL WIND

(LATIN: ANEMONE X HYBRID) Features semi-double pure white flowers. Great perennial for late season color. Deer and rabbit resistant. **Grows to 3-4' tall. Sun to part shade Zone 4**



ASTER, NEW ENGLAND

(LATIN: SYMPHYOTRICHUM NOVAE-ANGLIAE) It is a stout, leafy plant typically **grows to 3-6' tall** with a robust, upright habit. Features a profuse bloom of daisy-like asters with purple rays and yellow centers from late summer to early fall. Full sun Zone 4-8



ASTER, PURPLE DOME

(LATIN: NOVAE-ANGLIAE) grows 18-24" tall and up to 3' wide with a low, bushy habit. Features a profuse bloom of dark purple flowers which can entirely cover the plant with bloom from mid-August until early October. Full sun Zone 2-9



ASTILBE, DEUTSCHLAND

(LATIN: ASTILBE ARENDSII DEUTSCHLAND) Pure white, open, lacy, panicles dance above the flossy, deep green foliage. Attractive even when the plant is not in bloom. Great for brightening up shade gardens. **Grows 2'-2.5' tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, MONTGOMERY

(LATIN: ASTILBE JAPONICA MONTGOMERY) Dark magenta red, triangular shaped plumes are borne on darker red stems. Leaves emerge with a bronze red tint in spring, then turn dark green. **Height up to 20-24"**. Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, PEACH BLOSSOM

(LATIN: *ASTILBE JAPONICA PEACH BLOSSOM*) Delicate peach flowers with full plumes lend a frothy look to the clump. Glossy, green foliage. **Grows to 2' tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, PURPLE CANDLES

(LATIN: *ASTILBE CHINENSIS PURPLE CANDLES*) Dense, poker- like plumes emerge rich violet red, then lighten up as they age. Bold, dark green foliage with a coarse texture. Has a unique look; makes a strong color statement in the garden. **Grows up to 3'-3.5' tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, RHEINLAND

(LATIN: *ASTILBE JAPONICA RHEINLAND*) Beautiful spikes of carmine-pink flowers in June. Showy perennial for rich summer color in shady areas. Best grown in evenly moist soils. **Grows to 2 1/2' tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, VISIONS

(LATIN: ASTILBE CHINENSIS VISIONS) Visions blooms in midsummer with large, plummy-raspberry pink flowers that really stand out from the foliage. Astilbes grow best in evenly moist soil. **Grows to 14"-16' Tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTILBE, VIS. IN PINK

(LATIN: ASTILBE CHINENSIS VISIONS IN PINK) Blooms are thick, upright and a pale pink in late spring/early summer. The foliage is an attractive blue green. This is a vigorous grower and will reach the **height of 2.5'-3' tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



ASTIBLE, VIS. IN RED

(LATIN: ASTILBE CHINENSIS VISIONS IN RED) Deep red buds open to pinkish-red flowers on dense, fuzzy plumes. Red stems and bronze green foliage enhances the vibrant blossoms. Forms a robust clump. **Grows up to 15-18" tall.** Partial shade Zone 4-9



BEARDTONGUE, CHERRY SPK. (*LATIN: PENSTEMON*) A super performer, punches up the color with twice the flower power of other Beardtongues. Flowers appear for twice as long and are much larger than other perennial Penstemons. Luscious cherry red bells with white throats adorn tall 20" stems for an incredibly long time, from late May into August. For best results fertilize and keep spent flowers removed to encourage re-blooming. Full sun Zone 5-9



BEARDTONGUE, PR. SPLEND. (*LATIN: PENSTEMON*) Flat rosettes send up **spikes to 2'** in May, topped with very large, bell shaped flowers in shades of pink and light lavender. Full sun Zone 4-8



BEARDTONGUE, PR. DUSK (*LATIN: PENSTEMON BARBATUS*) Plants form a low clump of green foliage, with upright spikes appearing in early summer. Flowers are vivid purple trumpets, attractive in the border and useful for cutting. **Grows up to 2' tall.** Full sun Zone 4-8



BEE BALM, CORAL REEF

(LATIN: MONARDA DIDYMA) Produces heads of large, shaggy deep-pink flowers in mid to late summer. Foliage is delightfully fragrant, and significantly more resistant to powdery mildew than older varieties. Excellent for cutting. **Grows to around 3'-4' tall.** Full sun to partial shade
Zone 3-8



BEE BALM, JACOB CLINE

(LATIN: MONARDA DIDYMA) a tall, vigorous, long blooming bee balm with enormous red blooms and fragrant foliage. Perfect for the back of any planting, it provides nectar for butterflies and hummingbirds, seed for birds and cover for wildlife. Removing old flowers extends the July through August bloom time. Deer resistant; mildew resistant foliage. **36-48 Inches tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 3



BEE BALM, ROCK RASPBERRY

(LATIN: MONARDA DIDYMA) This midsized selection has shaggy, deep raspberry-purple flowers. The foliage smells like mint when crushed. Displays above average resistance to powdery mildew. The more compact stature makes this useful in containers or tubs. A favourite of both butterflies and hummingbirds. Beebalm spreads quickly: reduce clump size in early spring. **Grows about 20" tall and wide.** Full to part shade. Zone 4-9



BL. EYED SUSAN

(LATIN: RUDBECKIA HIRTA) Produces masses of showy, golden yellow, daisy-like flowers from July to mid-October. Goldfinches love the seeds. Vigorous. Fertile, loose soil. **Grows to 2-3' tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



BL. EYED SUSAN, GOLDSTURM (LATIN: RUDBECKIA FULGIDA) Features radiant golden yellow, daisy like flowers that look wonderful in mass plantings. This plant is a butterfly magnet!! **Grows 2-3' tall.** Full sun Zone 4



BLANK. FLOWER, AZ. APRICOT (LATIN: GAILLARDIA) The compact, uniform mound of bright green foliage is covered in large blossoms from early summer into fall. The flowers are apricot with yellow tips and a darker orange center. **Grows to 12" high and wide.** Full sun Zone 3



BLANK. FLOWER, AZ. SUN

(LATIN: GAILLARDIA) Large, 3-inch dark red flowers have ruffled yellow edges. Arizona Sun has a long flowering period, blooming from June to September. A compact and uniform plant, it **will reach 8 to 10 inches tall with a spread of 10 to 12 inches.** Full sun Zone 3



BLAZING STAR, KOBOLD

(LATIN: LIATRIS SPICATA) This blazing star cultivar is a small, compact, upright, clump-forming perennial which typically grows **2-2.5' tall.** Features terminal, rounded, fluffy, deep purple flower heads appearing atop rigid, leafy flower stalks. Blooms in summer. Full sun Zone 3-8



BLEEDING HEART, KING

(LATIN: DICENTRA FORMOSA) Typically produces a foliage mound to **6-8" tall and 14" wide** of deeply-cut, fern-like, bluish-green leaves that persists throughout the growing season. Nodding, heart-shaped, rich carmine-rose flowers are carried above the foliage to 10-15" tall on long slightly leaning stems. Primary blooms in May and June, with flowering stopping in the heat of the summer, but with a possible rebloom when the weather cools in late summer to early fall. Shade Zone 3-8



BLEEDING HEART, PINK

(LATIN: DICENTRA FORMOSA) A garden favorite for years with long racemes of heart-shaped pink flowers. Blooms from mid-spring to June. **Can grow to 4' tall and 1 ½' wide.** Moist, well-drained soil. Part sun Zone 3-9



BLUEBEARD, BEYND MDNIGHT (LATIN: CARYOPTERIS) Caryopteris Beyond Midnight™ has a dense mounding habit. Long blooming. Provides late summer and fall color. Misty clusters of rich purple blue flowers envelop the glossy, dark green foliage. Butterflies, hummingbirds and bees all welcome this nectar source. Once established, this drought tolerant plant is virtually maintenance free. **Grows 2-2.5 ft. tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 5



BLUEBEARD, PETIT BLEU

(LATIN: CARYOPTERIS) Compact cultivar that is perhaps best noted for its dark blue flowers, glossy dark green foliage, free-branching habit and tight low-mounded growth. **It typically grows to 2-2.5' tall and as wide.** Dark green leaves remain attractive throughout the growing season. Dark blue flowers bloom from late summer into fall. Full sun Zone 5-9



BLUEBEARD, SUNSHINE BLUE (*LATIN: CARYOPTERIS*) Features golden foliage on compact shrubs typically **growing to 2 1/2 - 3' tall and as wide**. Foliage retains good golden color throughout the heat of the summer. Fragrant amethyst blue flowers bloom from late summer to early autumn. Full sun Zone 5



BLUEBEARD, SAPPHIRE SURF (*LATIN: CARYOPTERIS*) This compact, low-maintenance shrub produces a swell of stunning rich blue flowers from top to bottom in late summer and fall when few other plants are blooming. **Grows 2' tall with a width of 3'**. Sapphire Surf™ is deer and drought resistant. Use it in mass, in a perennial border or as a groundcover. Full sun Zone 5-9



BLUE PLUMBAGO (*LATIN: PLUMBAGO AURICULATA*) This perennial groundcover is especially striking late summer through autumn. Single gentian blue flowers start blooming in late summer and last through the first hard frost. Bright green foliage will turn a beautiful bronze red fall color. **Grows up to 12" tall**. Full sun Zone 5-9



BRUNNERA, JACK FROST

(LATIN: BRUNNERA MACROPHYLLA) The leaves of this beautiful new cultivar are silver with green venation all season long. It blooms in early spring with classic forget-me-not type blue flowers. **Grows 15" tall.** Part shade Zone 4-8



BRUNNERA, LOOKING GLASS

(LATIN: BRUNNERA MACROPHYLLA) Features an attractive clump of heart-shaped, silver leaves. Its metallic sheen is useful for brightening up shady parts of the garden. Tiny baby blue flowers dance above the foliage in spring. **Grows 12-15" tall.** Shade to part shade Zone 3



BRUNNERA, VARIGATA

(LATIN: BRUNNERA MACROPHYLLA) A superb specimen perennial, forming a clump of heart-shaped leaves boldly splashed with creamy-white and green. Sprays of bright blue Forget-me-not flowers appear in mid to late spring. **Grows 16 inches tall and 18 inches wide.** Shade Zone 2-9



BUGBANE, BRUNETTE

(LATIN: ACTAEA SIMPLEX) Small, creamy white, fragrant flowers appear in late summer to early fall in long, terminal racemes resembling fluffy spires rising well above the foliage on upright, stems. **It grows to 3-4' tall.** Shade Zone 3-8



BUGBANE, PINK SPIRE

(LATIN: ACTAEA SIMPLEX) Pink Spire is a bugbane that **grows to 2-4' tall** and is noted for its bronze-purple foliage and late summer spikes of fragrant, pale pink flowers. The bottlebrush-like flower spikes are typically in bloom from late summer into fall atop dark upright stems rising above a clump of astilbe-like, ternate compound, deep bronze-purple leaves. Full to part shade Zone 4-8



BUTTERFLY WEED, ORANGE

(LATIN: ASCLEPIAS TUBEROSA) Broad clusters of bright orange flowers occur in mid to late summer. Flower clusters are 2 to 5 inches across. **Grows 1-2 ft. tall.** Very attractive to butterflies, especially Monarchs. Sun Zone 4-9



BUTTERFLY WD, SOUL MATE

(LATIN: ASCLEPIAS INCARNATA) Broad clusters of deep rose-pink flowers occur in mid to late summer. Flower clusters are 2 to 5 inches. **Grows 1-2 ft. tall.** Very attractive to butterflies, especially Monarchs. Sun Zone 4- 9



CANDYLILY, DAZZLER SER.

(LATIN: PARDANCANDA NORRISII) Dazzler is a dwarf strain which features 6-petaled, saucer-shaped flowers in a variety of colors including yellow, orange, pink, purple and red **growing to 16" tall.** Flowers primarily bloom in July-August, with some sporadic continued bloom to frost. Each flower lasts only one day. Full sun to part shade Zone 5-9



CATMINT, CAT'S MEOW

(LATIN: NEPETA FAASSENII) It has a low compact habit **growing 1 to 2 ft. in height and spread** and will keep its mounded shape throughout the growing season. Its flowers are sky-blue with smoky purple calyces. Full sun Zone 3



CATMINT, PURRSIAN

(LATIN: *NEPETA FAASSENI*) It typically forms a spreading clump of decumbent, ascending and upright stems rising to **18-24" tall and spreading to as much as 36" wide**. Gray-green leaves and lavender-blue flowers are highly aromatic. Full sun Zone 3-8



CATMINT, WALKERS LOW

(LATIN: *NEPETA RACEMOSA*) The beautiful green-grey foliage really sets off the lavender-blue flowers of this catmint. Blooms almost all season long, average garden soils. Will benefit from some light shearing after the first flush of flowers in early summer. **Grows up to 2' tall**. Full sun Zone 4-8



CLEMATIS, BLUE BIRD

(LATIN: *CLEMATIS*) The graceful, nodding, slate-blue flowers are semidouble. This vigorous vine produces a heavy flush of flowers in the spring, followed by more sporadic flowering the rest of the growing season. Mulch base to shade roots. **Grows 10-15' tall with a 24-36" spread**. Full sun Zone 4



CLEMATIS, DR. RUPPLE

(LATIN: CLEMATIS) Compact growth and heavy flowering that is perfect for containers. It makes a good cut flower and the seedheads are beautiful, too! Blooms in late spring and again in late summer. This selection is more shade tolerant. **Height 8-10'**. Sun to part shade Zone 4



CLEMATIS, ERNEST MARKHAM (LATIN: CLEMATIS) Ernest Markham is a vigorous, late-flowering climber with abundant small flowers in summer. Blossoms are rich magenta, 4 inches across, with blunt-tipped sepals and light chocolate anthers. **Can grow up to 15' tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



CLEMATIS, HENRYII

(LATIN: CLEMATIS) Henryi features profuse, showy, eight-petals, 6-8" in diameter, white flowers with purplish brown anthers cover this vine in summer. **Grows to 6-8' tall and 3-6' wide.** Bloom on this cultivar comes primarily from the previous year's stems in early summer, but also occurs in a second flush later in the summer on the new (current year's) growth. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CLEMATIS, JACKMANII

(LATIN: CLEMATIS) 'Jackmanii' features profuse, 5-7", open, four-petaled, violet-purple flowers cover this vine in mid to late summer. **Grows 7-10' wide with a 3-6' spread.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CLEMATIS, NELLY MOSER

(LATIN: CLEMATIS) Nelly Moser features profuse, showy, eight-petaled, 6-8" diameter, pale mauve pink flowers with purplish brown anthers cover this vine in summer. Bloom on this cultivar comes primarily from the previous year's stems in late spring, but also occurs in a second flush later in the summer on the new growth. **Grows 6-8' tall and wide.** Sun to part shade Zone 4



CLEMATIS, SALLY

(LATIN: CLEMATIS) An extremely strong-growing and very free-flowering plant that can be used as a garden location plant or for growing in a container for the deck garden, patio or outdoor dining area. Normally pink-flowered clematis fade in strong sunlight but Sally holds its color and is in fact a deeper color when grown in strong sunshine. Grows to 4-5' tall. Full sun Zone 4-9



COLUMBINE, BLUE JAY

(LATIN: AQUILEGIA) Medium-compact perennial with an eye-catching bloom. Blooms in late spring and early summer. Large, light blue and white flowers. **Grows to the height of 11" tall.** Part shade Zone 3-9



COLUMBINE, ORIGAMI

(LATIN: AQUILEGIA) Eye catching red and white bicolor boasts an extended flowering period and neat, compact habit. **Grows up to 18" tall.** Part shade Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, CHEY. SPIRIT

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Brilliant color range is now available from seed. Cheyenne Spirit features sought-after shades of red, orange, purple, scarlet, cream, yellow and white. Well branched putting more flowers on every plant for high-impact landscapes and fuller containers. **Reaches 24 to 30 in. tall, 18 to 24 in. wide.** Full sun Zone 4-10



CONEFLOWER, CLEOPATRA

(LATIN: ECHINACEA CLEOPATRA) Compact, yet sturdy plants are lovely in perennial borders and patio pots. Highly useful in butterfly, wildlife and cutting gardens. Very carefree and adaptable to heat, humidity, drought and cold when established. **15-18" H x 18-24" W.** Full sun Zone

CONEFLOWER, DBL SCP CRAN

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Features cranberry red, pom-pom flowers with sturdy, upright clump of dark green foliage. **Grows 16-22" tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CONEFLOWER, HARV. MOON

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Huge, 4 inch wide, golden yellow blooms have overlapping petals and a bold orange cone. Another Big Sky series coneflower. **Grows to 24 to 29 inches tall with an 18 inch spread.** Full sun Zone 5



CONEFLOWER, HOT PAPAYA

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) The blooms emerge with papaya colored ray petals and a deep orange-yellow cone that are topped by a double, reddish-orange pompom. Each pompom has a remarkable papaya colored halo in the center that grows as it ages. **Fast grower to 34 in. tall, 18 to 24 in. wide.** Prefers moist, but well drained to get established, once established, it is very drought tolerant. Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, LEMON YELL.

(LATIN: ECHINACEA X BALSOMEMY) Bright yellow blooms sure to brighten a summer border! A must-have for a cutting garden, this drought tolerant perennial was bred for cold hardiness and compact form with prolific flowering over an exceptionally long season. **Fast growing; 24 to 26" tall, 16 to 22" wide.** Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, MAGNUS

(LATIN: ECHINACEA PURPUREA MAGNUS) Extra-large, purple-rose, daisy-like flowers with a center cone on **3-foot tall** stems from late spring through summer. Great sun-loving and drought tolerant perennial. Attracts butterflies! Stunning with Ornamental Grasses. Full sun Zone 3-8



CONEFLOWER, MANDARIN

(LATIN: ECHINACEA HYBRIDA BALSCANDI) Large, vibrant, deep orange, double blooms on a vigorous and compact plant. Beautiful, eye-catching color for sunny borders, meadow gardens, or container plantings. At season's end, the dried flower heads add fall interest. Moderate growing; reaches 22 to 24 in. tall, 18 to 20 in. wide. Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, POW WOW

(LATIN: ECHINACEA PURPUREA POW WOW) A profusely flowering Coneflower with unique, large, deep magenta flower petals surrounding a darker cone. Sturdy stems make for great cut flowers. **Grows 20 to 24 inches tall.** Drought tolerant. Great for landscapes. Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, POW. BERRY

(LATIN: ECHINACEA PURPUREA) Large 3" fragrant blooms flower earlier than most Echinacea and continue reblooming well into early fall. Deep rose purple blooms are fade-proof and stay attractive as a fresh picked summer berry. Charming and compact at only **24" tall** with sturdy branching which means lots of blooms that hold up nicely even under adverse weather conditions. Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, PURPLE

(LATIN: ECHINACEA PURPUREA) This is one of the finest native perennials for today's landscape. The 2-3" flowers have a brown central cone surrounded by rosy-purple colored petals. Begins to flower in midsummer and continues until fall. Good cut flower. Tolerant of heat, drought, and wind. **Grows up to 30" tall.** Full sun Zone 3-8



CONEFLOWER, ROCKY TOP

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Rocky top is a Tennessee coneflower seed cultivar that typically **grows to a compact 24-30" tall.** It features daisy-like coneflowers with well-spaced, upward-turned pink rays and black central cones. Flowers bloom from June to August with some sporadic later bloom. Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



CONEFLOWER, SALSA RED

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Big, bright red blooms for an easy, colorful summer border. A must-have for sunny gardens, this drought tolerant perennial was bred for cold hardiness and compact form with prolific flowering over an exceptionally long season. Moderate growing; reaches 24 to 26 in. tall, 16 to 22 in. wide. Full sun Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, SOLAR FLARE (*LATIN: ECHINACEA*) The flowers are large, single and fragrant with petals a deep magenta-red surrounding a dark cone. As the flowers mature, they fade to an attractive smoky-rose. Coneflowers begin blooming in midsummer. **Grows to the height of 2.5' tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4-9



CONEFLOWER, SOMB. ORNGE (*LATIN: ECHINACEA*) Sombrero Adobe Orange features intense orange flowers with the same color cone. Has pretty green foliage. **Grows to 18-20" tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CONEFLOWER, SOMB. YELLOW (*LATIN: ECHINACEA*) Sombrero Lemon Yellow features fragrant, rich yellow flowers with sturdy upright clumps of dark green foliage. **Grows to 2' tall.** Full sun to part sun Zone 4



CONEFLOWER, VIRGIN

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) Virgin is a compact white-flowered coneflower that grows in an upright clump to **18-24" tall and to 12-18" wide** on sturdy, well-branched stems that do not need staking. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



CONEFL, POW WOW WHITE

(LATIN: ECHINACEA) A profusely flowering Coneflower with unique large, white flower petals surrounding a yellow center. Sturdy stems make for great cut flowers. **Grows 20 to 24 inches tall.** Drought tolerant. Great for landscapes. Full sun Zone



COREOPSIS, BERRY CHIFFON

(LATIN: COREOPSIS VERTICILLATA) Vibrant two-tone creamy white flower with a raspberry eye blooms from spring through fall. Bushy and compact matures at **18 to 22 inches tall and wide.** Great in mixed borders and beds. Full sun Zone 4



COREOPSIS, COSMIC EYE

(LATIN: COREOPSIS) Exploding with color, Cosmic Eye Coreopsis flowers are single claret red daisies tipped in golden sunshine yellow. Foliage is slender, dark green leaves on a very compact plant, **growing 12-15 inches high and 15 inches wide.** Full sun Zone 5



COREOPSIS, CREAM & RED

(LATIN: COREOPSIS) Features very large cream colored flowers with dark red centers. Blooms late spring to late summer. Moderately drought tolerant. **Grows 12-14" tall.** Full sun Zone 5



COREOPSIS, CRÈME BRULEE

(LATIN: COREOPSIS VERTICILLATA) Larger, darker flowers than Moonbeam Coreopsis, and the foliage is brighter green and more mildew-resistant. Yellow serrated flowers appear among the foliage for a fuller appearance from summer to fall. A late summer cutback will trigger renewed flowering in fall. **Grows 12 to 20 inches tall and 12 to 18 inches wide.** Full sun Zone 4



COREOPSIS, ENCHANTED EVE (*LATIN: COREOPSIS*) Features buttery yellow flowers with a soft red eye in the center. Blooms early summer to early fall. **Grows to 8-12" tall.** Full sun Zone 5



COREOPSIS, GOLD & BRONZE (*LATIN: COREOPSIS*) This prize-winning perennial keeps its neat shape and performs well all summer long. Bright, golden yellow flowers with flashy, orange-red banded petals appear continuously above the vigorous, upright, mound of mildew resistant foliage. Perfect for massing in low maintenance borders or summer containers. Moderate growing; **reaches 12 to 14 in. tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 5-9



COREOPSIS, MERCURY RISIN (*LATIN: COREOPSIS x MERCURY RISING*) An exceptional red, cold hardy Coreopsis with velvety magenta-claret petals and a center that is bright golden-yellow. **Reaches 15 to 18 inches tall and 24 to 36 inches wide** with fresh green foliage backing the flowers. Full sun Zone 5



COREOPSIS, YELLOW & RED

(LATIN: COREOPSIS X 'BALUPTOWED) This prize-winning perennial keeps its neat shape and performs well all summer long. Bright yellow flowers with red-banded petals appear continuously above the vigorous, upright, mounded foliage. Moderate grower; **reaches 12- 14" tall and wide.** Perfect for massing in low-maintenance borders or summer containers. Once established, water occasionally; more in extreme heat or containers. Resists mildew. Full sun Zone 5-9



COREOPSIS, ZAGREB

(LATIN: COREOPSIS VERTICILLATA) Features bright yellow, daisy-like flowers with untoothed rays and darker yellow center disks. Flowers appear singly in loose clusters in a lengthy late spring to late summer bloom. **Grows in dense, bushy clumps to 1-3' tall** and is more compacted. Full sun Zone 3-9



DAISY, BANANA CREAM

(LATIN: LEUCANTHEMUM) A superb selection with huge 4-5", lemon yellow flowers which brighten to creamy white. Well budded plants have an extra-long bloom time in summer. **Grows 15-18" tall.** Full sun Zone 5



DAISY, BECKY

(LATIN: LEUCANTHEMUM) A profusion of large, single white flowers with bright yellow centers appear on stems **36 inches** above the dense, green clumping foliage. Flower heads hold up extremely well after a heavy rain. Blooms abundantly from summer to fall if deadheaded. It's perfect as a cut flower. Full sun Zone 5



DAISY, SUNBEAM

(LATIN: LEUCANTHEMUM) A wonderful summer-blooming perennial with large daisy flowers. Colorfast deep yellow single blooms petals contrasting deep golden centers carried on very strong stems. This variety is very floriferous with improved disease resistance. It prefers well-drained soil in the sunny border. Deadhead to encourage continuous bloom. **Grows 3 ft tall and 1 ½ ft. wide.** Full sun Zone 5



DAYLILY, ANN WARNER

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) A strong and reliable bloomer. A vigorous plant that is heat and drought tolerant. Very adaptable. **Grows to 24" tall.** Full sun Zone 2



DAYLILY, CHICAGO APACHE

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Scarlet red flowers have slightly ruffled edges, small yellow watermark and green throat. Blooms mid-season from June to August creating a bright impact in the summer garden with sunfast color. **Grows to 30" tall.** Sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, DOUBLICIOUS

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Bright orange-peach double flowers. Mid-season blooms with gorgeous color. **Grows to 20" tall.** Full sun Zone 4



DAYLILY, FRANS HAL

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Lovely and eye-catching, the bicolored golden yellow and rusty orange ruffled blooms with a green throat are trumpet shaped. The grassy green foliage forms a dense mound. Spent flower scapes can be trimmed back after blooming. **Grows to 2' tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, HAPPY RETURNS

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Bright, 2.75" canary yellow blooms. One of its parents is 'Stella d' Oro' and it is a good rebloomer. **Grows to 18" tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, HYPERION

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) A midseason bloomer with very fragrant, 5" lemon yellow flowers. A midseason bloomer. **Grows to 40" tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, JUDY JUDY

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Judy Judy Daylily features bold fragrant lavender trumpet-shaped flowers with rose overtones, yellow throats and yellow edges at the ends of the stems from mid to late summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its grassy leaves remain green in color throughout the season. The fruit is not ornamentally significant. It will grow to be about **24 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 20 inches.** Full sun Zone 3



DAYLILY, KOKOMO

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) An early-blooming Daylily has golden flowers with a red eye. A long bloom season and multiple flowering cycles are perfect for mass plantings. Exhibits good rust resistance. **Reaches 15 to 18 inches tall by 8 to 12 inches wide.** Sun Zone 5



DAYLILY, LITTLE BUSINESS

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) A small-flowered cultivar with rose-raspberry flowers with darker veining and chartreuse throats. **Grows to the height of 15" tall.** Individual flowers open for one day. Blooms in early mid-season with repeat bloom. Full sun Zone 4



DAYLILY, MARY TODD

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Bright yellow flowers that bloom in late June. **Will grow to the height of 24-30" tall.** A prolific bloomer and very hardy. Full sun Zone 4



DAYLILY, NOSFERATU

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Large 6", fragrant, shimmering dark purple flowers with a chartreuse throat and ruffled petals are borne on strong, well branched, and heavily budded. **Grows 24" tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, PARDON ME

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) A midseason bloomer with fragrant, 2.75" cranberry-red flowers with sturdy ruffled petals. Can rebloom through the season. **Grows up to 18" tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, PEACH BLAST

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Enjoy an explosion of peachy-rose blooms with a lavender eyezone and deep green throat throughout the summer with this reblooming daylily. The rose colored blooms are nicely complimented by the bright green, strap-like foliage. **Grows 15-24" tall with a 15-18" spread.** Sun Zone 4-8



DAYLILY, PRAIRIE BLUE EYES

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Tolerant of heat and humidity, this is a favorite perennial for colorful summer blooms. Displays beautiful lavender flowers with yellow-green throats on tall stems. A mid-season bloomer. Good for firescaping. Semi-evergreen in mild winter areas. **A vigorous grower to 2 1/2 ft. tall.** Full sun Zone 4



DAYLILY, ROSY RETURN

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Rosy Returns is a dwarf, ever blooming daylily that typically **grow to 12-14" tall.** Rose-pink flowers appear in clusters in summer that rise slightly above the foliage. Flowers bloom from late May through September. Flowers are fragrant. Full sun to part shade Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, RUBY SPIDER

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) This multiple award winning daylily produces gigantic 9", deep ruby red flowers with long, spoon-shaped petals. The petals open wide and flat, displaying the prominent gold throat and midribs. Makes a huge visual impact in the garden. **Can grow close to 3' tall.** Full sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, RUBY STELLA

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Ruby Stella Daylily features bold ruby-red trumpet-shaped flowers at the ends of the stems from early to late summer. The flowers are excellent for cutting. Its grassy leaves remain green in color throughout the season. **Grows to the height of 26" tall.**
Full to part sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, SCENT. SUNDANCE

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) This variety has deep golden-yellow blooms with a delightful fragrance. Repeats constantly from May to frost. Flowers are similar to 'Stella de Oro' but a fair bit larger. **Grows 16-18" tall.** Sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, STELLA D'ORO

(LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS) Bright, 2.75" gold blooms. The classic everblooming daylily, blooms from June until frost. Excellent in mass plantings. **Grows to 15" tall.** Sun Zone 3-9



DAYLILY, STRAWBERRY FIELD (*LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS*) Strawberry fields is a clump-forming evergreen perennial with narrow strap-like green leaves. In late spring and mid-summer, erect stems bearing large, pink flowers with darker pink eyes, ruffled edges and a yellow throat. **Grows to 2 ft. tall.** Sun Zone 3



DAYLILY, STRAWBERRY SWIRL (*LATIN: HEMEROCALLIS*) A swirl of stawberry-pink flowers with pale yellow sepals and cream mid-ribs makes this daylily a real beauty. These stunning flowers are produced throughout the season and sit atop bright green, strap-like foliage. **Grows 14-18" tall with a 15-18" spread.** Sun Zone 4-8



DIANTHUS, ALURA RED (*LATIN: DIANTHUS*) Loads of double red blooms over a dense cushion of grey green foliage. Great fragrance for bouquets and boutonnières. Hardy and weather resistant. **Reaches 6-12" tall and wide.** Perfect to brighten up patio tubs and borders early in the season. Butterfly friendly! Full to part sun Zone 4-9



DIANTHUS, CLASSIC CORAL

(LATIN: DIANTHUS) This colorful perennial produces fragrant, double coral pink blossoms atop a tight, compact mound of blue-green foliage. **Grows to 8-10" tall.** Full to part sun Zone 4



DIANTHUS. CRAN. COCKTAIL

(LATIN: DIANTHUS) This colorful perennial produces carnation-like, double, hot magenta pink flowers atop a low mound of grey-green foliage. **Grows to 8-10" tall.** Full to part sun Zone 4



DIANTHUS, CRANBERRY ICE

(LATIN: DIANTHUS) Midsized in habit, offering fragrant single blooms from spring right into the autumn, over a low mound of grassy blue-green leaves. This selection has fringed petals of bright cranberry red with a contrasting rose-pink eye. Grows 8-14" tall and wide. Deadhead to encourage more buds to form. Attractive to butterflies. Evergreen. Sun Zone 5



DIANTHUS, ELECTRIC RED

(LATIN: DIANTHUS) Features double, rich flower with blue-green foliage. **Grows 8-10" tall.** Full sun Zone 4



DIANTHUS, FIREWITCH

(LATIN: DIANTHUS) Fragrant, magenta pink blossoms are produced prolifically over low, silvery blue mats of evergreen foliage. Often reblooms in fall. **Grows up 12" high and wide.** Full to part sun Zone 3-9



FALSE INDIGO

(LATIN: BAPTISIA AUSTRALIS) Blue false indigo is an upright perennial which typically **grows 3-4' tall.** It features purple, lupine-like flowers in erect racemes atop flower spikes extending well above a foliage mound of clover-like, bluish-green leaves. Blooms in spring. Full sun to part shade zone 3-9



FALSE INDIGO, MOONLIGHT

(LATIN: BAPTISIA) an upright perennial that typically **grows to 3-4' tall**. It features a spectacular spring bloom of butter yellow, lupine-like flowers in erect flower spikes extending well above the foliage mound of clover-like, bluish-green leaves. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



FALSE INDIGO, TWILIGHT

(LATIN: BAPTISIA) Twilight produces almost 100 flower spikes of unique deep violet-purple flowers highlighted by a lemon-yellow keel. Held above the handsome blue-green foliage, the inflorescences can be up to 32 inches long. **Grows to the height of 5' tall with a 3' spread**. Full to part sun Zone 4-8



FERN, BRILLIANCE

(LATIN: DRYIOTERUS ERYTHROSORA) A beautiful specimen for shade loving gardens/landscape. Green showy bi-pinnate fronds. At maturity this fern forms a tapestry of glossy green vase shape. **Moderate growing; reaches 18 to 24 in. tall, 18 in. wide**. Mainly used for groundcover but is drought tolerant once established. Shade Zone 5



FERN, CHRISTMAS

(LATIN: *POLYSTICHUM ACROSTICHOIDES*) Christmas fern typically grows in a fountain-like **clump to 2' tall** and features leathery, lance-shaped, evergreen (green at Christmas time) fronds. The young fiddleheads in spring are silvery and scaled. Evergreen fronds provide good winter interest for the landscape. Shade Zone 3-9



FERN, CINNAMON

(LATIN: *OSMUNDA CINNAMOMEA*) Cinnamon fern typically grows in **clumps to 2-3' tall, but with constant moisture can reach 5' in height.** The familiar "fiddleheads" also emerge from the base of the plant and unfurl into large, erect, pinnately-compound, yellowish-green, sterile fronds which remain attractive throughout the summer and turn yellow in autumn. Shade Zone 3-9



FERN, OSTRICH

(LATIN: *MATTEUCCIA STRUTHIOPTERIS VAR. PENNSYLVANICA*) Ostrich fern is a clump-forming, upright to arching, deciduous fern which typically **grows 2-3' tall.** The showy parts of this fern are the finely dissected, medium green, vegetative fronds which exhibit the feathery appearance of long ostrich plumes. Full shade Zone 3-7



FERN, ROYAL

(LATIN: *OSMUNDA REGALIS*) a tall, deciduous, Missouri native. Typically grows in clumps to 2-3' tall, but with constant moisture can reach 6' in height. Broad fronds have large, well-separated leaves which give this fern an almost pea-family appearance. Fronds typically turn yellow to brown in autumn. Shade Zone 3



GAURA, WHIRLING BUTTERFLY (LATIN: *LINDHEIMERI*) This gaura cultivar is a compact, clump-forming, vase-shaped perennial with wiry, arching red stems, pink flower buds and 4-petaled snow white flowers which appear in long, terminal, wand-like panicles above the foliage over a very long late spring to autumn bloom period. Typically grows 2-3' tall. Full sun Zone 5-9



GERANIUM, BOKOVO

(LATIN: *GERANIUM X CANTABRIGIENSE*) Biokovo typically grows 6-10" high and features masses of 5-petaled white flowers which are tinged with pink at the base of each petal. The overall flower effect is that of a very pale pink geranium. Blooms in late spring. Biokovo runners extend further than those of the original hybrid, and therefore do not form as dense a foliage carpet. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



GERANIUM, DARK REITER

(LATIN: GERANIUM PRATENSE) A beautiful mounding Geranium with finely dissected reddish-purple foliage. Deep blue-purple flowers in summer. **Grows 8-10 inches tall with a 10-12 inch spread.** Partial shade Zone 4



GERANIUM, JOHNSON BLUE

(LATIN: GERANIUM) Johnson's Blue is one of the most popular blue-flowered geraniums. It is a perennial that typically grows in a dense spreading mound to **12-18" tall and to 24-30" wide.** Large, saucer-shaped, sky blue flowers bloom in clusters above the foliage from late spring to early fall. Deeply cut dark green foliage. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-8



GERANIUM, PERFECT STORM

(LATIN: GERANIUM) It forms a low, bushy mound of velvety grey-green leaves, bearing a long display of small cup-shaped magenta-pink flowers with a contrasting black eye. If flowering stops in midsummer, prune plants back to 4 inches if desired. **Grows 12" tall with a 26-20" spread.** Full sun to part shade Zone 5-9



HELLEBORE, FRENCH KISS

(LATIN: HELLEBORUS) Features 3-3.5" single flowers with white blooms that have raspberry pink veining. Reliable evergreen perennial for the shade. **Grows to 18-24" tall.** Caution: Poisonous if ingested. Shade Zone 4



HELLEBORE, RIO CARNIVAL

(LATIN: HELLEBORUS) Vigorous grower that produces numerous single yellow flowers with heavy burgundy speckling in early spring. The large flowers are yellow with burgundy speckling. Helleborus bloom early so spring bulbs will also be in bloom in your garden. **18 inches tall by 24 inches wide.** Shade Zone 4



HELLEBORE, SPANISH FLARE

(LATIN: HELLEBORE) Spanish Flare features single, light yellow flowers with maroon flares concentrated around the nectaries. Site these where they will stay for many years, since the plants resent being disturbed. Trim the old leaves to the ground in late winter to give the flowers maximum impact. **Grows 1.5 to 2 feet tall.** Shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, APPLETONI

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Medium sized, lime green leaves have a silver overlay and form a dense mound of foliage. Dark rose red stems hold rich ruby red flowers. **Grows 8-10" tall.** Sun to shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, BLACKBERRY ICE

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Prized for its iridescent purple leaves with a softly luminescent pewter overlay. Forms a full, rounded mound of foliage topped by reddish-purple scapes and cream flowers. **Grows 10- 12" tall.** Sun to shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, CAN CAN

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) The heavily ruffled silver-grey leaves have contrasting dark veins and a rich wine-red reverse. Taller sprays of ivory flowers appear in late spring. Grows 10-25 inches tall with a spread of 12-18 inches. Pinkish fall colour. Trim off any withered or tired-looking leaves in spring. Evergreen. Sun to shade Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, CARAMEL

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) This Coral Bells has rich, honey-apricot leaves that **grow 10 to 16 inches tall and 18 inches wide.** This variety has excellent heat and humidity tolerance in the south and sun tolerance in cool northern gardens. Partial shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, CINN. CURLS

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Cinnamon curls features curvy orange, red and purple foliage. Deer don't care for its lovely foliage which stays evergreen in many climates. It will grow very vigorously and the unique colors will be strongest when grown in partial shade. Grows to the **height of 12" tall and 20" wide.** Part shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, FIRE ALARM

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) This low-growing selection features thick, leathery, red leaves that change from orange-red to bronze-red throughout the season. Short sprays of small white bell flowers in summer. **Grows 8-10" tall with a 10-14" spread.** Shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, GEORGIA PEACH

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Spectacular glowing peach colored leaves with alight silver overlay measuring up to 8” across give this plant incredible impulse appeal. Creamy white flowers. **Grows up to 14”**. Shade to part sun Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, GOLDEN ZEBRA

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) This selection forms a mound of feathery, bright yellow leaves that are boldly marked with dark red. Sprays of small white bell flowers appear in spring. Evergreen in mild winter regions. Foliage should be left alone in the fall, but plants may be tidied up in spring by removing any brown or tired-looking leaves. **Grows 8-10” tall with a 10-14” spread**. Shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, LAVA LAMP

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Features sizeable clumps of large, coppery-purple leaves with deep purple stems that carry creamy flowers. Naturally heat and humidity tolerant. **Grows to 16” tall**. Part shade Zone 4



HEUCHERA, OBSIDIAN

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Dark maroon, almost black foliage is as glossy and smooth as the volcanic glass it was named for. Has a compact habit and holds its intense color all season long. Flowers are insignificant on this cultivar. **Grows to the height of 16-24" tall.** Shade Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, PALACE PURPLE

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Large, star shaped leaves range in color from deep olive green to purplish-bronze with amethyst purple undersides. Tiny cream colored flowers that **grows to 12-24" tall.** Shade Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, PEACH PARFAIT

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Peach Parfait pops in the shade with eye-catching, slightly ruffled peachy foliage touched by deep orange veining and silver highlights. Does exceptionally well with the heat and humidity. An excellent addition to a shady garden or mixed container. **10-12" in height.** Full shade. Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, PLUM CRAZY

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Rich silver highlights on deep purple foliage shine in the shade, with hints of mauve peeking out from the undersides of the leaves that pack a punch of fantastic foliage, tidy mounding habits and exceptional heat and humidity tolerance. **Grows to 12- 18" tall.** Shade to part sun Zone 4



HEUCHERA, PL. PUDDING

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Neat, compact mounds of shiny, shimmering plum-purple foliage grows 8 to 10 inches tall and 12 to 18 inches wide. Has sprays of tiny white flowers in early summer. Perfect for edging and borders. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-9



HEUCHERA, SWEET TEA

(LATIN: HEUCHERA) Striking orange foliage is emblazoned with huge star-shaped bursts of cinnamon. Big, palmate leaves darken in the summer and lighten in the fall. Great accent for shady woodland gardens, containers, or mixed beds. Evergreen in mild climates; an herbaceous perennial in colder regions. **Foliage reaches 20 in. tall, 28 in. wide; blooms reach 28 in. tall.** Shade to sun Zone 4



HIBISCUS, BIG HIT

(LATIN: HIBISCUS) Prolific 6 to 8-inch pink flowers with a dark pink throat bloom from late summer to fall. A hybrid between American and Asian species that provides hardiness and showiness. **Reaches 5 feet tall and 3 feet wide.** Has very disease resistant foliage.



HIBISCUS, CRANBERRY CRUSH (LATIN: HIBISCUS) A naturally compact selection that works well in large containers. Large 7-8", deep scarlet red flowers are produced all over the dense, rounded clump of deep green, leathery, maple like leaves. **Grows 3-4' tall.** Full to part sun Zone 4



HIBISCUS, KOPPER KING

(LATIN: HIBISCUS) A compact plant that reaches **4 feet tall** and wide with copper-red, foliage. Creamy-pink flowers appear all summer with a bright red eye that streaks through the petals, and is up to **12 inches wide.** Full sun Zone 4



HIBISCUS, MIDNIGHT MARVEL (*LATIN: HIBISCUS*) a mound-shaped, well-branched shrub which typically reaches **4' high and wide**. It features violet-purple, maple-shaped leaves in spring and summer which reach nearly a foot long. The leaves turn a brilliant orange in fall and contrast nicely with the 9-10' diameter carmine-red blooms which begin in midsummer and continue until frost. Full sun Zone 5-9



HIBISCUS, PERFECT STORM (*LATIN: HIBISCUS*) A naturally compact selection that works well in large containers. Large 7-8", white flowers with a red eye are produced all over the dense, rounded clump of deep black-purple maple like leaves. **Grows to 3' tall**. Full to part sun Zone 4



HIBISCUS, PLUM FANTASY (*LATIN: HIBISCUS*) Valued for their showy late-summer display of enormous satiny blooms. They form upright, bushy mounds well suited to the back of a perennial border. **Grows 4-5' tall and wide**. This outstanding selection features puckered and crinkled petals in magenta-red over dark green foliage. Dies back completely to the ground in winter, but new growth is slow to appear in spring, be patient! Full sun Zone 4 and 5



HOSTA, AUGUST MOON

(LATIN: HOSTA) Golden yellow foliage with white flowers in July and August. Prefers moist, rich, well-drained soil. Higher light intensities will bring out the yellow tones in the leaves. **Grows to 20" tall.** Part sun to full shade Zone 3-8



HOSTA, BIG DADDY

(LATIN: HOSTA) Classic award winning blue hosta. Forms a large, upright, compact clump of thick, rounded chalky blue leaves. **Moderate growth 3 feet tall, 2 feet wide.** Foliage becomes puckered and cupped as it matures and deepens to blue green as summer progresses. Near white, bell-shaped flowers. Shade Zone 4



HOSTA, BLUE ANGEL

(LATIN: HOSTA) Large blue-leaved, giant-sized clump of striking, deep blue foliage and attractive clusters of near-white flowers make this plant worth leaving space for in the garden. **Mounding to 32 inches high by 70 inches wide.** Partial shade Zone 3



HOSTA, BRESSINGHAM BLUE

(LATIN: HOSTA) This large specimen selection has outstanding cupped, powdery blue leaves with a puckered appearance. Near-white flowers appear in July. **Can grow to 2 ½ ft. tall and 4' wide.** Hosta go completely dormant in the fall, and the dying foliage can be removed any time before mid-spring. Shade Zone 2



HOSTA, DEJA BLU

(LATIN: HOSTA) This selection has blue-green leaves, yellow margins and a cream 'lightning bolt' flashing through the center. Lavender flowers in midsummer. **Grows to the height of 12-14" tall.** Also good for planting in mixed containers or tubs. Hostas go completely dormant in the fall, and the dying foliage can be removed any time before mid-spring. Easily divided in either spring or fall, but plants may be left alone for years. Shade Zone 2



HOSTA, FRANCEE

(LATIN: HOSTA) Francee is a medium-sized Hosta that **grows 2 feet tall and 4 feet wide.** Wonderful white margins contrast with the green heart-shaped leaves. It produces lavender flowers in late summer and performs well in sun or shade. Prefers partial shade Zone 3



HOSTA, GREAT EXPECT.

(LATIN: HOSTA SIEBOLDIANA) Expect great slug and sunburn resistance on this center-variegated, Elegans type, mounding, shade-loving perennial. Slightly puckered, deep blue-green, oval leaves feature creamy-yellow centers. **Matures at 28 inches tall and 30 inches wide.** Partial shade Zone 4



HOSTA, GUACOMOLE

(LATIN: HOSTA) An exciting, large mound of chartreuse-centered foliage, producing large fragrant flowers in late summer. **Grows 16 to 24 inches high and up to 36 to 54 inches wide.** Excellent for containers and woodland gardens. Part shade Zone 4



HOSTA, HALCYON

(LATIN: HOSTA) Mid-sized blue hosta with a long season of appeal. Leaves are frosty blue-green and pointed. **Grows 2 feet tall and 4 feet wide.** Foliage has a heavy substance and is slug resistant. Pale blue-violet flowers. Partial shade Zone 4



HOSTA, JUNE

(LATIN: HOSTA) A Halcyon mutation is one of the most beautiful hostas in many years. Chartreuse center turns gold with blue edge that streaks into the center. Lavender flowers bloom late summer. **Grows 18 to 24 inches tall and 24 inches wide.** Part shade Zone 3



HOSTA, KROSSA REGAL

(LATIN: HOSTA) A superb regal hosta with huge silver-blue foliage becoming more green with maturity. Lavender flowers in mid-summer on stalks 4 to 5 feet tall. Upright and spreading shape **maturing at 2 feet tall and wide.** Excellent in landscape or container. Partial shade Zone 3



HOSTA, MINUTEMAN

(LATIN: HOSTA) Has the widest, whitest, cleanest edging on a Hosta. **Matures at 18 to 22 inches tall and 36 inches wide.** This is a good plant for groundcover, edging, accent plantings, and containers. Perfect for formal and informal designs. Partial shade Zone 4



HOSTA, PATRIOT

(LATIN: HOSTA) Patriot is a hosta cultivar that features a **12-20" tall mound** of large, variegated, oval, basal leaves which have deep green centers and wide irregular white margins. Foliage mound will typically spread to 24-30" wide. Racemes of bell-shaped, lavender flowers appear in summer on scapes rising well above the foliage mound to 34" tall. Full to part shade Zone 3-8



HOSTA, PAUL'S GLORY

(LATIN: HOSTA) Blue to dark green leaf margin contrasts beautifully with the gold center, which begins the season chartreuse. Pale lavender, bell-shaped flowers appear on 40-inch stems in mid-summer. This moderate grower **mounds to 25 inches high and 55 inches wide**. Partial shade Zone 3



HOSTA, STAINED GLASS

(LATIN: HOSTA) This mid-sized specimen selection has bright golden-yellow leaves with a wide, streaky green margin. Pale lavender flowers appear in August. Some direct sun will bring out the best possible color. **20" tall with a 45" spread**. Part sun to shade Zone 2-9



HOSTA, SUM & SUBSTANCE

(LATIN: HOSTA) This largest Hosta cultivar features an immense mound of light green to chartreuse to medium gold foliage depending on light level. Pale lavender flowers on 48" spikes adorn this **30" high by 70" wide specimen**. Partial shade Zone 3



HYSSOP, BLUE FORTUNE

(LATIN: AGASTACHE) A profusion of upright bloom spikes covered with small, powder blue, tubular flowers. The aromatic, green foliage has a peppermint-lemon scent when brushed against or crushed. Wonderful summer color for warm, dry regions. **Quickly grows 18" tall and wide**. Full to part sun Zone 4-9



HYSSOP, PEACHIE KEEN

(LATIN: AGASTACHE) Features peach flowers with mauve calyxes. Dense, rounded foliage. This plant is heat and drought tolerant. Blooms midsummer to early fall. **Grows to 20-24" tall**. Sun Zone 6
