

SHRUBS

ABELIA, CANYON CREEK

(LATIN: ABELIA X 'CANYON CREEK') Uniquely colored, evergreen to semi-evergreen Abelia with copper-tinged yellow foliage that gradually turns soft yellow, then green. Fall color is bronze with rose highlighting. Clusters of small, fragrant and pinkish-white flowers summer to frost. Matures at 3-5 feet tall and 5-6 feet wide. Full to part sun Zone 6-9



ABELIA, PINKY BELLS

(LATIN: Abelia x) Grows as a low-growing, tight and tidy mound of glossy foliage, bearing extra-large pink-violet blooms all summer long. **Grows 2-3' tall with a 3-4' spread.** New growth flushes red for an extra-colorful display. Its elegant fountain-like habit makes it especially well-suited to planting along or atop walls where its big bell-shaped flowers can be truly appreciated. Sun to part shade Zone 6-9



ABELIA, SUNSHINE DAYDREAM (LATIN: ABELIA X GRANDIFLORA 'ABELOPS') Splendid tricolor evergreen foliage emerges dark pink with green and white variegation, and softens to dreamy pink, golden yellow and green hues as the season progresses. Fragrant white blooms open in summer and develop a rosy tone as they mature. Moderate growing; reaches **3 to 4 ft. tall and wide**. Partial to full sun Zone 6-9



ALTHEA, BLUEBERRY SMOOTH (LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Blueberry Smoothie Rose of Sharon is a multi-stemmed deciduous shrub with an upright spreading habit of growth. Blueberry Smoothie Rose of Sharon features bold blue trumpet-shaped flowers with purple overtones along the branches from mid-summer to early fall. Grows 8' tall and 4' wide. Full sun Zone 5



ALTHEA, BLUE CHIFFON (LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Large blue flowers in late summer. Adaptable and easy to grow. Deer resistant. Attracts butterflies. It is heat and drought tolerant. Attracts Butterflies, hummingbirds and birds. The shrubs stand 8-12 feet tall, with a spread of 6-10 feet, at maturity. Full sun Zone 5



ALTHEA, BLUE SATIN

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Large single, rich royal blue flowers are certain to draw attention. Blue Satin is a uniform plant with rich color. This vigorous grower reaches **8 – 12' tall and 4-6 feet wide**. Full sun Zone 5-8



ALTHEA, DANICA

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Double blossoms that feature white petals with red to pink stained tips. Flowers are produced from late July to the first hard frost of fall. Typical Rose of Sharon habit that's upright and vase shaped. **Grows 8-12' tall with a 6-10' spread**. Great for hedges and vertical accents. Grown in both shrub and patio tree form. Full sun Zone 5-7



ALTHEA, DOUBLE PINK

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Medium size, upright growing, slender, well-branched shrub **reaching 8 to 10 feet tall and 4 to 6 feet wide** with bright green serrated leaves. It is easily grown, tolerating a wide range of soil and moisture conditions. It produces an abundance of pink blossoms in late summer. Full sun Zone 5



ALTHEA, DOUBLE PURPLE

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Medium size, upright-growing, slender, well-branched shrub **reaching 8 to 10 feet tall and 4 to 6 feet wide**. Has bright green serrated leaves and produces purple blossoms in late summer. It is easily grown, tolerating a wide range of soil and moisture conditions. Full sun Zone 5



ALTHEA, LAVENDER CHIFFON

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Large lavender white flowers are adorned with a lacy center to create an anemone-like bloom. This **shrub grows 8-12 feet tall**, adds bold color in late summer. A strong growth habit lends itself to pruning into a tree form or an upright shrub. Full sun Zone 5-8



ALTHEA, LIL KIM

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) A unique dwarf Rose of Sharon with a refined, upright habit. Dark green foliage backs the stunning summer flowers that last up to 3 days, compared to the day-long blooms typical of the species. **Moderate grower; reaching 3-4' tall and wide**. The crisp white blooms punctuated by a bold maroon eye are less likely to produce viable, unwanted seedlings. Full sun Zone 5-9



ALTHEA, PEPPER. SMOOTH

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Beautiful double bi-colored red and pink peppermint flowers adorn this upright shrub summer through fall. **Matures at 8 feet tall by 4 feet wide.** Easily adapts to various soil types and tolerates drought. Full sun Zone 5



ALTHEA, WHITE CHIFFON

(LATIN: HIBISCUS SYRIACUS) Large single flowers appear in late summer and are adorned with a lacy center to create an anemone-like bloom. **Grows 8-12' tall with a 6-8' spread.** Adaptable and easy to grow, plant White Chiffon near brightly colored Butterfly Bush for a beautiful butterfly garden. Full sun Zone 5-7



ALTHEA TREE FORM

The althea also comes in tree form. These varieties include

ARBORVITAE, BOWLING BALL (*LATIN: THUJA OCCIDENTALIS*) A unique compact, perfectly global Arborvitae with dense fine-textured, soft, sage green foliage resembling a fine-textured juniper or False cypress. Requires little or no shearing. **Mature size is 2.5 feet tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 3-8



ARBORVITAE, FILIPS MAGIC (*LATIN: THUJA OCCIDENTALIS*) Filips magic moment is a compact, evergreen shrub of narrow upright columnar habit with sprays of bright golden-yellow foliage. **Slow-growing to 6-8' tall with a 1-3' spread** and it will maintain its glowing color year-round. Full sun Zone 3-7

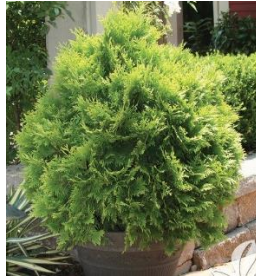


ARBORVITAE, HETZ MIDGET (*LATIN: THUJA OCCIDENTALIS*) A small, dense, globe shaped evergreen with dark green, scale like foliage. This slow grower **matures at 3-4 feet tall and wide.** It's excellent for formal gardens or ornamental patio containers. Full sun Zone 4-8



ARBORVITAE, SUNKIST

(LATIN: THUJA OCCIDENTALIS) A compact, upright Arborvitae that has deep golden foliage. It displays dense, flattened sprays of orange-yellow foliage in winter, and lemon-yellow in spring. Matures at **5 to 8 feet tall and 4 to 7 feet wide**. Sun to part shade Zone 4



AZALEA, BLOOM-A-THON

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) An evergreen, disease resistant, reblooming azalea with large flowers that appear in spring, again in summer and will rebloom in the fall until a hard frost. Azaleas range from **6 feet tall and 4 feet wide**. High summer temperatures don't stop late summer and fall flowers. Light shade Zone 6



AZALEA, ENCORE

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) This repeat bloomer has dark pink, single form flowers. It has lustrous green foliage in summer and purple foliage in winter. It is the coldest hardy of the Encore Azaleas. **Mature size of 4 feet tall and wide**. Light shade Zone 6-9



AZALEA, GIBRALTER

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Spectacular flame-orange flower clusters set the landscape ablaze in Spring. A great impact plant for the garden. Use as a specimen plant, or plant in a grouping for a large burst of color. The dark green foliage is very attractive also. Mildew resistant and very heat tolerant. **Mature size 6 feet tall and wide.** Deciduous. Part sun to light shade Zone 6-9



AZALEA, GIRARD ASHLEY

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Extremely hardy evergreen Azalea, with large rose-red flowers that bloom in spring on strong sturdy branches. The Girard's are adaptable to the South and colder climates. Vigorous and medium size, **grows 2 feet tall and 2 to 3 feet wide.** Light shade Zone 5



AZALEA, GIRARD CRIMSON

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Extremely hardy evergreen Azalea with mid-season, deep rose-red flowers and brilliant red foliage in early fall. Their medium size growth habit is vigorous enough to make them adaptable to the south as well as in the colder climates. **Matures at 2-4 feet tall and 3-4 feet wide.** Part shade Zone 5



AZALEA, GIRARD HOT SHOT

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Extremely hardy evergreen, with large fiery orange-red to scarlet blooms and beautiful foliage in the fall. Their medium size growth habit is enough to make the adaptable to the south as well as in the colder climates. **Matures at 2.5 to 3' tall and 3 feet wide.** Part shade Zone 5



AZALEA, HERBERT

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Stunning clusters of double lavender orchid flowers bloom in spring. Has an open, spreading growth habit **reaching 2 to 4 feet tall and 3 to 5 feet wide.** Excellent to use as a hedge, in mass plantings or as a specimen. Part shade Zone 5



BAMBOO, CAMPBELL

(LATIN: FARGESIA ROBUSTA) This bamboo is an elegant, evergreen, clump-forming bamboo with tall and slender, rich deep green canes adorned with pale, almost white, semi-persistent culm sheaths, creating a striking bicolor display in the spring through early summer. **Grows to the height of 12-15' tall.** Full sun to part sun Zone 7



BARBERRY, ADMIRATION

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) a very strong, bushy, and colorful shrub for the garden. It has glossy, oval leaves that are purple-red and yellow-edged. In the fall it shows off its crimson berries and leaves. The delicate pale pink flowers appear throughout the summer. **Grows 12-18" tall with a 18-24" spread.** Full sun to part shade. Zone 3



BARBERRY, CONCORDE

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) This rounded form features dark purple foliage from spring to fall. Small yellow flowers are followed by bright red berries. **This slow grower matures at 24 inches tall** and is perfect for edging or containers. Full sun Zone 4-8



BARBERRY, CRIMSON PYGMY

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) A compact variety features deep crimson foliage from spring to frost. It has a neat, compact, rounded growth habit and a slow to moderate growth rate. **A plant 6-8 years old will be only 2 feet tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 5-8



BARBERRY, ORANGE ROCKET

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) A compact upright-growing deciduous shrub with small red leaves that turn a ruby red in autumn. Early summer pale yellow flowers are followed by small, crimson red berries.

Will reach 6-8 feet tall in ten years. Full to part sun Zone 4-9



BARBERRY, SUNJOY CITRUS

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) this bright yellow golden barberry has a neat, rounded habit that results in a globe-shaped plant. It makes an excellent low-maintenance hedge, needing little if any pruning to maintain its shape. **Grows 2-3 ft. tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 4



BARBERRY, SUNJOY TANGELO

(LATIN: BERBERIS THUNBERGII) this neatly mounded beauty offers brilliant orange foliage edged in chartreuse. The branching is excellent and the color is strong. Tangelo stands up to drought. Compact, dense, deciduous shrubs that offers burn-resistant foliage. **Standing 4-5' high and wide untrimmed.** Sun Zone 4



BAYBERRY, BOBBEE

(LATIN: MYRUCA PENNSYLVANICA) It grows to 6' high with a 6- to 8' spread and has a mounded shape. The foliage is deep forest green, and

the fruit is aromatic. It tolerates acidic soils and wet or dry sites. Full to part sun Zone 3



BEAUTYBERRY, PURPLE GIANT (*LATIN: CALLICARPA DICHOTOMA*) A lovely, graceful shrub in its own right, begins its extravagant show in summer with dainty pink, pollinator loving flowers covering the branches, then exploding in Autumn with cluster after cluster of purple berries that last throughout the winter months. Grows to the height of 5-6' and a spread of 3-4'. Deer resistant. Full to part sun Zone 5-9



BITTERSWEET, AUT. REV.

(*LATIN: CELASTRUS SCANDENS*) A revolutionary breakthrough in bittersweet culture. The majority of the flowers formed on this plant are perfect, meaning that the flower itself has both male and female parts. So you only need one plant to bear fruit. **This vine gets up to 25 feet** and the fruits are a beautiful orange-red. Full sun Zone 2-8



BLUEBEARD, SUNSHINE BLUE (*LATIN: CARYOPTERIS*) Amethyst blue flowers contrast with the bright yellow foliage for an outstanding late summer to early fall display. This attractive mounding shrub is stunning in mixed borders, perennial gardens and adored by butterflies. **Grows 2 to 3 ft. tall and wide.**

Makes a great accent plant. Do not overwater. Drought tolerant once it is established. Full sun Zone 5-9



BOXWOOD, CHICAGOLAND

(LATIN: BUXUS) This Boxwood has a compact broad-ovate habit and excellent hardiness. Medium green in summer and a slight bronze tint in winter. A sister to Green Velvet, but faster growing. Will reach **3 to 4 feet in height with a 5 foot spread**. Sun to part shade Zone 4



BOXWOOD, COLUMNAR

(LATIN: BUXUS) Columnar Boxwood is a popular tall narrow boxwood also in the green mountain family. **It will remain 2 feet or less in width, and will reach 8 to 10 feet tall.** It holds its natural shape with little pruning. You can plant this one in containers for an exclamation point in the garden. It is said to pull through winter looking great. A very good shrub for limited space. Full to part sun Zone 4-9



BOXWOOD, DEE RUNK

(LATIN: BUXUS SEMPERVIRENS) A larger growing boxwood that forms a tall tight column up to **10 feet tall yet only 2 feet wide**. Leaves are up to 1 inch long and 3/8 inches wide and are dark glossy green. A dramatic

garden accent or a screen in the landscape. Full sun to part shade
Zone 5-8



BOXWOOD, GREEN MOUNT. (*LATIN: BUXUS*) An upright, pyramidal shape and bright green summer color gives Green Mountain Boxwood a unique place in the landscape. **Grows to 5 feet tall and 4 feet wide**, with a dense, compact growth habit. Full to part sun Zone 4-9



BOXWOOD, GREEN VELVET (*LATIN: BUXUS*) This hardy globe-shaped Boxwood features dark green foliage that retains its color in winter. It is a moderate grower, **reaching 3 feet tall and wide**. It is an excellent plant for hedges and borders. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-9



BOXWOOD, JULIA JANE (*LATIN: BUXUS MACROPHYLLA*) Upright habit with lime-green new growth on dark green foliage, turning bronzy-green in winter. Hardy Korean type boxwood. Deer resistant. **Grows to 4' tall and wide**. Full to part sun Zone 5



BOXWOOD, JUSTIN BROUW. (*LATIN: BUXUS SINICA VAR. INSULARIS*) Evergreen Boxwood with a compact, rounded to mounding growth habit. **Matures at 2 to 3 feet tall and wide.** Has very dense dark green foliage that maintains color in winter. Deer and drought tolerant. Excellent in borders or as a specimen. Sun to part shade Zone 6



BOXWOOD, LITTLE MISSY (*LATIN: BUXUS MICROPHYLLA*) Little Missy is a compact mounding to rounded cultivar. It is extremely cold hardy and sun tolerant.. It is a great choice for uses where ultimate desired size is in the **2' x 2' range.** Foliage is very dark green, slightly rounded and comes to a pronounced point at the end of the leaf. Sun to shade Zone 5-8



BOXWOOD, SPRINTER

(LATIN: *BUXUS MACROPHYLLA*) An improved, fast-growing boxwood with lustrous evergreen foliage that has excellent hardiness and stays attractive year-round. The upright habit **2 to 4 ft. tall and wide**. A great pick for use in as a low hedge, as it fills in more quickly than slower growing boxwoods. Sun or shade Zone 5-9



BOXWOOD, VARDER VALLEY

(LATIN: *BUXUS SEMPERVIRENS*) This is a dense, compact, many-branched, broad mounded evergreen shrub. Slow annual growth. **Typically grown as a 2-3' tall shrub with a larger spread**. Greenish yellow flowers appear in spring. Flowers are sparse and insignificant, but fragrant. Small round medium leaves with a blue hue. Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



BURNING BUSH, DWARF

(LATIN: *EUONYMUS ALATUS COMPACTUS*) A compact, slow-growing, **deciduous shrub 5 to 6 feet in height**. It forms a dense, twiggy, and flat-topped mound. Dark green leaves turn a brilliant rose-red in fall. Excellent as background, screen, or accent against darker evergreens. Full sun Zone 4-9



BURNING BUSH, LIL' MOSES

(LATIN: *EUONYMUS ALATUS*) At only **3-4'** (rather than 6'), this true dwarf has even REDDER, longer lasting autumn foliage and is virtually

fruitless (no seedling problems); forms a handsome dense mound from the base. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-8



BURNING BUSH, RUDY HAAG (*LATIN: EUONYMUS ALATUS*) An upright, flat-topped, spreading, deciduous shrub which is a dwarf cultivar growing only to a **height of 3-5'**. Very slow growth rate (3-4" per year). Dark green elliptic to obovate leaves turn bright red in fall (pinkish red in full shade). Fall color can be spectacular. Small, yellowish green flowers appear in May but are not showy. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



BUSHCLOVER, GEMPEI

(*LATIN: LESPEDEZA*) This plant has a weeping to mounded habit with showy pink and white flowers in late summer. **Grows 4-5 ft. tall and wide.** It is very drought tolerant. Prune almost to the ground in late winter or early spring to encourage new growth and larger flowers. Use in massing or tuck into the perennial border for showy late summer accent. Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



BUTTERFLY BUSH, MS MOLLY (*LATIN: BUDDLEIA*) Bright, rich, reddish-pink flowers bloom in profusion from midsummer to frost. A neat plant with silvery gray foliage and

compact branching Deadhead spent flowers to encourage rebloom.
Grows 4-5 feet tall and 3-4 feet wide. Full sun Zone 5-10



BUTTERFLY BUSH, PUGSTER BL (LATIN: BUDDLEIA) Large, dense, fragrant, delightful blue flower panicles on a tidy, compact plant. **Grows 2' tall and 2-3' wide.** Provides continuous summer color well into fall. Thick stems provide better winter hardiness for a dwarf form. Deciduous. Full sun Zone 5-9



BUTTERFLY BUSH, PUG AMTH. (LATIN: BUDDLEIA) This Buddleia dons large, full cool purple flowers blooming atop thick, sturdy stems from early summer to frost. Compact habit, **reaching 2 to 3 feet tall and wide.** Excellent for mixed borders and beds. Full sun Zone 5



BUTTERFLY BUSH, TUTTI FRUTI (LATIN: BUDDLEIA) Tutti Frutti features bright fuchsia-pink blooms and scented foliage. This plant is great for use in smaller areas of the garden. **Matures at 1-2 feet tall and wide.** Heat and drought tolerant. Full sun

Zone 5-7



CHASE TREE, SHOAL CREEK

(LATIN: VITEX AGNUS-CASTUS) Rugged and reliable, a selection of an old fashioned favorite that grows into a large shrub or small tree. **Mature height is 8-15 feet tall.** It produces small fragrant blue-violet flowers throughout the summer above dark, gray-green, and compound foliage. This plant is well suited for hot climates. Full sun Zone 6



CHOKEBERRY, AUT. MAGIC

(LATIN: ARONIA MELANOCARPA) Waxy dark green foliage along with spring white flowers make for a nice mass planting. **Average size is 5 to 7 feet high and 3 to 5 feet wide.** Fall color is a mix of bright reds and dusty purples, accompanied by an excellent black berry set holding well into the winter. Full sun to part shade Zone 3-8



CHOKEBERRY, LO SCAPE

(LATIN: ARONIA MELANOCARPA) As cute as a button yet tough as nails, this innovative dwarf aronia may be the closest thing yet to a perfect landscape plant. Adaptable to most any soils, this little beauty offers dark glossy foliage, loads of white flowers in spring, black summer fruit, and intense red foliage in autumn. Ideal for low-maintenance, appealing

mass planting. **Grows 1-2' tall and 2-3' wide.** Full sun to part shade
Zone 3



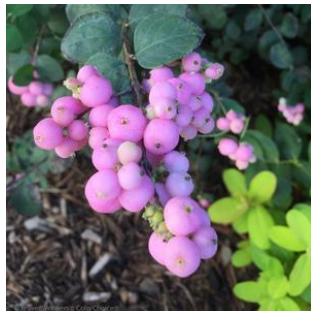
CORALBERRY, CANDY

(LATIN: SYMPHORICARPOS X DOORENSII) This is a dwarf variety of the classic Snowberry bush. Vibrant green foliage on arching branches that explodes in elegant pink flowers throughout summer. As autumn approaches your blooms will merge into plump, pink berries. Winter brings a drop of the foliage, but the berries will remain to add decorative interest to your yard. **Grows 3-4 feet tall and wide.** Full to part sun Zone 4-8



CORALBERRY, PROUD

(LATIN: SYMPHORICARPOS) Cute, rounded, bluish-green leaves look handsome all season, then, in late summer, bell-shaped flowers appear. As the season changes to autumn, the flowers develop into large dark pink berries, the color intensifying with cold weather. **Grows 3-' tall with the same spread.** As pretty as it is, this North American native is also amazingly tough, effortlessly fending off deer, cold weather, and problem soils. The fruit is not edible, but may be eaten by birds in mid-late winter. Full sun Zone 3



CRAPEMYRTLE, DYNAMITE

(LATIN: LAGERSTROEMIA INDICA) Gorgeous large cherry-red clusters of flowers appear prolifically from midsummer to frost. Leathery leaves turn orange in the fall giving this stellar plant added landscape punch. This sun-loving deciduous plant **matures to 20 feet tall**. It is highly resistant to powdery mildew. Full sun Zone 6



CRAPEMYRTLE, POKOMOKE

(LATIN: LAGERSTROEMIA INDICA) Dark green foliage topped with deep rose-pink flowers blooming from midsummer until frost. **Average size is 2 feet tall and 3 feet wide**. Full sun Zone 6



CR. MYRTLE, PR. SERIES

(LATIN: LAGERSTROEMIA INDICA) Full sun Zone 6

- **Princess Holly Ann**- 4-5' tall, 2-3' spread, cherry red blooms



- **Princess Kylie- 2-3' tall, 2-3' spread, magenta blooms**



- **Princess Lyla- 1.5-2' tall, 1.5-2' spread, rose pink blooms**



- **Princess Zoey- 4-5' tall, 3' spread, red and pink blooms**



- **Princess Jaden- 1.5-2' tall, 1.5-2' spread, lavender blooms**



CRAPEMYRTLE, VICTOR DWF (*LATIN: LAGERSTROEMIA INDICA*) The Victor Crape Myrtle is a dwarf variety that **grows 3 to 4 feet tall** and wide, and the deep red blossoms start in June, and bloom through to September. The leaves turn a vibrant orange-red in the fall. Full sun Zone 6



CRAPEMYRTLE, ZUNI

(LATIN: LAGERSTROEMIA INDICA) Medium lavender flowers from mid-July to late September and orange red fall color make this Nation Arboretum hybrid a continuous show. It is quite mildew resistant and cold hardy. **Matures to 5 to 10 feet tall** with a rounded growth habit. Full sun Zone 6



CYPRESS, GOLD MOPS

A dwarf Golden Thread leaf false cypress, this slow growing, mounding cultivar has more intense yellow thread-like foliage in full sun. **It grows 3-5 feet tall with an equal spread** and is deer resistant. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



CYPRESS, KINGS GOLD

(LATIN: CHAMAECYPARIS PISIFERA) King's Gold Falsecypress is a compact, mounding, dwarf, threadleaf variety with golden yellow foliage. **Matures at 3 to 5 feet tall with an equal spread.** Excellent choice for mass plantings. Sun to part shade Zone 4



CYPRESS, MINIMA

(LATIN: CHAMAECYPARIS LAWSONIANA) Compact, dwarf conifer with light green foliage. **Grows 2-3 ft. tall and wide.** Moist soil. Very slow growing. Low Maintenance. Full sun Zone 4



CYPRESS, SUNGOLD

(LATIN: CHAMAECYPARIS PISIFERA FILIFERA) Compact, mounding shrub with consistent golden yellow new foliage, even in full sun. **Slow growing 5 to 6 ft. tall, 7 to 8 ft. wide.** Excellent mop-headed accent plant that makes nice background border or small hedge. Full sun Zone 4



DEUTZIA, CHAR. PEARLS

(LATIN: DUETZIA GRACILIS) Crisp, lime-yellow foliage provides season long color long after the pure white, pearl like buds explode into a shower of fragrant spring flowers. An attractive compact shrub **grows to 2-3 feet tall and wide.** Great for the perennial garden or shrub border. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



DEUTZIA, SPRING SENSATION (*LATIN: DEUTZIA 'KOLMASPRI'*) Spring Sensation Deutzia is covered in stunning, lightly-scented white cup-shaped flowers at the ends of the branches, from mid to late spring. It has dark green foliage throughout the season. The serrated oval leaves turn an outstanding burgundy in the fall. **Grows 5' tall and wide.** Sun Zone 4



DEUTZIA, YUKI CHERRY BL. (*LATIN: DEUTZIA "NCDX2"*) This stunning plant **grows just 1 to 2 feet tall**, but in the spring it puts on one impressive color show! The creamy white blooms are blushed with magenta markings, creating a carpet of cherry blossoms over a low, spreading bush. The foliage is deciduous, coming on a dark green and turning burgundy in the fall. Deer resistant. Full sun to part shade. bloom Zones 5 to 8.



DIERVILLA, KODIAK ORANGE (*LATIN: DIERVILLA RIVULARIS*) Bright yellow flowers in early summer contrast with lush green foliage. In the fall the leaves turn amazing red and orange hues. A mounding easy-growing shrub **reaches 3 to 4 feet tall and wide.** Deer and drought tolerant. Great in masses. Sun to shade Zone 4



DIERVILLA, KODIAK BLACK

(LATIN: DIERVILLA RIVULARIS) Bright yellow flowers in summer contrast with the striking burgundy-black foliage. A mounding, easy-growing shrub **reaches 3 to 4 feet tall and wide**. Deer and drought tolerant. Excellent planted in masses. Sun to shade Zone 5



DOGWOOD, ARCTIC FIRE

(LATIN: CORNUS STOLONIFERA) This compact selection of Red Twig Dogwood has dark red stems that provide a spectacular show in the winter sunlight. Unlike most Cornus that reach 8 to 10 feet tall, Arctic Fire grows to only half the height. Great in perennial or shrub borders, or used in flower arrangements. **Reaches 3 to 4 ft. tall and wide**. Partial to full sun Zone 3



DOGWOOD, ARTIC SUN

(LATIN: CORNUS SANGUINEA) This special smaller variety has beautiful yellow stems tipped with red providing a spectacular winter show. It was selected for its naturally compact stature and full branching. **Reaches 3 to 4 feet tall and wide**. Stunning planted in containers or used in cut floral arrangements. Cut vibrant stems for a dynamic addition to holiday arrangements. Part to full sun Zone 4-9



DOGWOOD, BAILEY RED

(LATIN: CORNUS SERICEA) An excellent red stem dogwood that provides beautiful color in winter. Porcelain blue fruits. Shade tolerant. Very adaptable. **Grows 8-10 feet tall with equal spread.** Full sun to part shade Zone 2-7



DOGWOOD, CAYENNE

(LATIN: CORNUS AMOMUM) This native selection stands out because the bright red stems shine all winter. Fresh green foliage looks good all summer and porcelain blue berries form in late summer. Good orange red fall color. Grows to 6-8' tall with a 8-10' spread. Full sun Zone 4-9



DOGWOOD, MUSKINGUM

(LATIN: CORNUS RACEMOSA) This is a slow growing, mounded plant that has distinctive gray-brown stems that offers an excellent winter effect. The attractive gray-green foliage changes to a distinctive brick-red in the fall, showcasing its bountiful crop of luminous white berries. Creamy-white spring flowers have a lilac-like scent. Muskingum is a low-growing form of Gray Dogwood, **2 feet high with a 4 foot spread.** Salt tolerant, insect and disease resistant. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



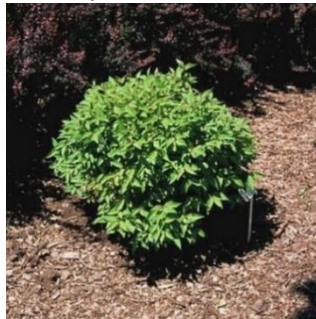
DOGWOOD, NEON BURST

(LATIN: CORNUS ALBA) Attractive chartreuse foliage and is a compact selection **growing 4-5' tall**. It has good sun and heat tolerance, retaining bright leaf color throughout summer without scorching. New leaves are tinged with bronze and the stems have a rich red hue early in the season. Fall foliage becomes a rainbow of purple, red, yellow and orange. In winter the stems turn glossy scarlet red. Full sun Zone 2-7



DOGWOOD, RED GNOME

(LATIN: CORNUS ALBA) An extremely compact and dense, upright-rounded form with bright red stem color and creamy white spring flowers and deep burgundy-red fall foliage. A great narrow hedge, screen or accent plant. **Matures at 3 to 4 feet tall and 4 to 5 feet wide**. Sun to part shade Zone 3



ELDERBERRY, BLACK TOWER

(LATIN: SAMBUCUS) A very upright shrub selected for its dark purple-black leaves. Two-tone pink flowers bloom in summer followed by purple berries in the fall. **Quickly reaches 6 to 8 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide**. Great for narrow spaces. Sun to part shade Zone 4



FORSYTHIA, GOLD TIDE

(LATIN: FORSYTHIA CORTASOL) Gold Tide is a dwarf forsythia cultivar that is noted for its compact-spreading shape, **typically growing to only 20" tall but spreading to as much as 4' wide**. It features light yellow flowers that appear in profusion before the leaves emerge in late winter to early spring. Early bloom makes this shrub a true harbinger of spring. Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



FORSYTHIA, LYNWOOD GOLD

(LATIN: FORSYTHIA X INTERMEDIA) Bright yellow flowers open fully along the stems in early spring before leaves emerge. Very hardy, upright shrub that **will reach 6 to 8 feet tall and wide**. Excellent choice for mass plantings. Deer tolerant. Full sun Zone 4



FORSYTHIA, SHOW OFF

(LATIN: FORSYTHIA X INTERMEDIA) Compact, fast growing shrub with darker green foliage than other varieties. Showy, large, bright yellow flowers blanket the plant from the ground up in early spring. **Will reach 3 to 6 feet tall and wide**. Perfect for hedges. Full sun Zone 4



FORSYTHIA, SPRING GLORY

(LATIN: FORSYTHIA X INTERMEDIA) Showy, rounded shrub that explodes in brilliant masses of yellow flowers. Use as a background shrub or as an accent in the perennial garden. Upright grower, excellent as a screen. Deciduous. Grows to the **height of 5-10' tall with a 4-7' spread**. Full sun Zone 3



FORSYTHIA, SUGAR BABY

(LATIN: FORSYTHIA NIMBUS) Smallest variety of the Show off series. Dwarf and upright habit. Bright yellow, early spring flowers the entire length of each branch. They maintain their shape and require little pruning. Use it in a shrub border, or as a specimen in a small garden. **1-2' tall with a 2-3' spread**. Zone 4



FOTHERGILLA, BLUE SHADOW

(LATIN: FOTHERGILLA) Produces white honey-scented flowers at branch tips on a nicely mounded habit of icy blue-green foliage in spring. Slow growing, reaches 3-5' tall and 4-5' spread. Weeks of stunning fall colors of red, orange and yellow. Provides unique color to the landscape as a foundation plant. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-9



FOTHERGILLA, DWARF

(LATIN: FOTHERGILLA) It is a compact, slow-growing, mounded, deciduous shrub that typically **grows 2-3' tall and as wide**. Flowers in dense terminal bottlebrush-like spikes bloom in spring. Leaves turn often brilliant shades of yellow, orange and red in fall. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



FOTHERGILLA, RED LICORICE

(LATIN: FOTHERGILLA) Red Licorice is best noted for its superb licorice-red fall color. Bottlebrush-like white flowers in spring, attractive foliage and brilliant red fall color give this shrub excellent spring to fall interest. It is a slow-growing, deciduous shrub that **grows 6-10' tall with an upright spreading habit**. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



GINKGO, TSCHI TSCHI

(LATIN: GINKGO BILOBA) A rounded, dwarf form of the ancient Ginkgo. This cultivar has a rounded crown with dense, slow growth. The leaves turn a beautiful butter-yellow in the fall. Grows to be about 4-5' tall. Full sun Zone 3-8



INKBERRY, SHAMROCK

(LATIN: ILEX GLABRA) This handsome compact form of the native Inkberry has lustrous dark green leaves. It is a slow growing evergreen shrub, reaching **3 to 4 feet tall and wide**. It tolerates wet sites. Excellent for foundation, hedges, masses and as an accent plant. Sun to part shade Zone 4



ITEA, LITTLE HENRY

(LATIN: ITEA VIRGINICA) Sweetly scented, pure white flowers on a low mounded, compact bush. Arching branches are loaded with blooms in early summer. Produces brilliant fall colors. **Grows 1.5 to 2 feet tall and 3 feet wide**. Full to part sun Zone 5



JUNIPER, BLUE RUG

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS HORIZONTALIS) A spectacular very low trailing Juniper, with definite silver-blue color. Good growth habit with a full center. Excellent for a ground cover or bank planting. **Grows to a height of 6- 8 inches and spread to 6-8 feet**. Full sun Zone 3



JUNIPER, CALGARY CARPET

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS SABINA) Spreading branches with flaring sprays of feathery soft green foliage form a juniper with a nest like appearance. Great foundation plant, or for mass plantings. Grows to **the height of 12-24" Tall with a 3-4' spread.** Full sun to part shade Zone 3



JUNIPER, DAUBS FROSTED

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS CHINENSIS) Soft textured, blue-green foliage is accented by golden new growth. Great for erosion control along banks and slopes. Full sun, well-drained soil drought resistant once established. **Grows 2-3 feet tall and 6 feet wide.** Full sun Zone 4-9



JUNIPER, GREY GUARDIAN

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS VIRGINIANA) This beautiful greyish-blue low spreading Juniper, a sport from Grey Owl, has a tighter growth habit and more vivid color. It is perfect as a foundation plant growing **2 to 3 feet tall and 3 to 5 feet wide.** Full sun Zone 4



JUNIPER, GREY OWL

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS VIRGINIANA) A low, spreading Juniper that **grows 2-3 feet tall and 4-6 feet wide**. The finely-textured foliage is an attractive silver-blue. The outer branches are thread-like and open, becoming denser toward the center. Full sun Zone 4



JUNIPER, SAYBROOK GOLD

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS CHINENSIS) By far the brightest gold juniper, “superior” to all gold tip types on the market. The bright color is maintained through all seasons. **Grows 2-3 feet tall and 6 feet wide**. The low compact profile is ideal for foundation or mass plantings. Full sun Zone 4



JUNIPER, SEA GREEN

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS CHINENSIS) Fine-textured, bright green foliage is displayed on gracefully arching branches. This fountain or semi-vased, compact evergreen **grows 4-6 feet tall and 6-8 feet wide at maturity**. Full sun Zone 4



JUNIPER, SKANDIA

(LATIN: JUNIPERUS SABINA) A low-growing, semi-spreading evergreen matures at **14-18 inches high and 6 feet wide**. The pale, grayish-green, feathery foliage holds its color over the winter. Good for foundation or mass border plant. Blight resistant. Full sun Zone 3



KERRIA, GOLDEN GUINEA

(LATIN: KERRIA JAPONICA) It's the very large gold single flowers that give 'Golden Guinea' kerria its name. **Grows to the height of 3-5' tall with like spread**. They appear in early spring and repeat during the summer, like a shower of gold coins. Attractive bright green stems. One of the best flowering shrubs for shade. Full sun to shade Zone 5-9



KERRIA, PLENIFLORA

(LATIN: KERRIA JAPONICA) A very popular double-flowered cultivar that features rounded, pom-pom-like, yellow flowers. It typically grows taller to **8-10'** and more upright than the species. Part shade to sun Zone 4



LILAC, COMMON PURPLE

(LATIN: SYRINGA VULGARIS) This old fashioned lilac is the one most of us remember from our youth. A perfect informal hedge or screen, it has extremely fragrant, purple flowers in May. Color may vary from purple to lilac and occasionally even white. **Grows to 12-15 feet tall and 8-12 feet wide.** Full to part sun Zone 2-7



LILAC, COMMON WHITE

(LATIN: SYRINGA VULGARIS) This hardy vigorous shrub is the white version of the old fashioned favorite. It has attractive foliage, single white flowers, and makes a great informal hedge or screen. **Grows to 12-15 feet tall and 8-12 feet wide.** Full to part sun Zone 2-7



LILAC, DWARF KOREAN

(LATIN: SYRINGA MEYERI) This dwarf variety has an excellent uniform habit and red-purple buds that open to fragrant, single pale lilac flowers. **Grows 4-5 feet tall and 5-7 feet wide.** Full sun Zone 3-7



LILAC, MISS KIM

(LATIN: SYRINGA PATULA) This hardy lilac from Korea has purple buds that open to single, fragrant, pale lilac flowers when other lilacs have finished. **It grows 6-7 feet tall and 5-6 feet wide** with a broad, spreading shape. Full sun Zone 3-7



LILAC, SENSATION

(LATIN: SYRINGA VULGARIS) This hybrid lilac has single, fragrant, deep purple flowers that are bordered with a distinctive white edge. This upright rounded shrub blooms in May and provides unique cut flowers. This lilac can **reach up to 10' tall with a 12' spread**. Full sun Zone 3



MOCK ORANGE, SNOWFLAKE (LATIN: PHILADELPHUS X VIRGINALIS) A deciduous shrub that grows to only **5-8' tall and wide**. Features fragrant, double white flowers that bloom profusely in late spring. Flowers appear in clusters with 5-7 flowers per cluster. It has oval, dark green leaves. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



NINEBARK, AMBER JUBILEE

(LATIN: *PHYSOCARPUS OPULIFOLIUS 'JEFAM'*) Rounded and dense in habit, this shrub with its bold colors of orange, yellow and gold, will stand out in your garden. Delicate white bloom are produced in spring, and fall foliage is highlighted with tones of red and purple, making this ninebark appealing over the entire season. Grows to the **height of 6-8 feet tall and 5-6 feet wide**. Full to part sun Zone 2-7



NINEBARK, GINGERWINE

This fuss-free deciduous shrub with sparkling burgundy foliage and unique peeling bark creates a stunning backdrop in shrub borders. Spring foliage is a radiant orange. Pink-white blooms are lovely in floral arrangements. **Rounded, upright form; reaches 5 to 6 ft. tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 3-7



NINEBARK, LITTLE DEVIL

(LATIN: *PHYSOCARPUS OPULIFOLIUS 'DONNA MAY'*) This Ninebark features deep burgundy foliage throughout the season and small white-pink clusters of flowers in June. **Growing only to 4 feet**, it makes a great background or shrub border. It is also disease and pest resistant and requires very little maintenance. It keeps its great compact shape without pruning. Full sun Zone 3



NINEBARK, SUMMER WINE

(LATIN: *PHYSOCARPUS OPULIFOLIUS* 'SEWARD') Neat compact branching and fine, deeply cut, dark crimson-red leaves. This native variety has pinkish-white, button-like flowers in mid-summer. It is very showy and is extremely hardy. Used as a landscape shrub, **maturing at 5 to 6 feet tall and wide**. Full sun to part shade Zone 3



NINEBARK, TINY WINE

(LATIN: *PHYSOCARPUS OPULIFOLIUS*) Dainty white flowers bloom in late spring up and down the stem and provide a showy display. The small refined leaves are dark bronze-maroon and colorful all season. An extra bushy plant that **grows 3 to 5 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide**. Sun to part shade Zone 3



PINE, DWARF MUGO

(LATIN: *PINUS PINE*) This is a dwarf, low-growing, spreading pine. Nice dark evergreen, stiff needles that are 2 - 3 inches long. **Grows 4' tall and 5' wide**. Very tolerant - can handle poor, rocky, dry, windy conditions. Widely used in foundation plantings, and is an excellent choice for bonsai projects and Japanese gardens. Full to part sun Zone 3



PLUM YEW, DUKE

(LATIN: CEPHALOTAXUS HARRINGTONIA) A graceful shrub with a spreading, mounded habit. This selection has a very fine texture, with dense, glossy, needle-like foliage that maintains color year-round. Good for small gardens, low hedges or borders. Deer resistant. Evergreen. **Slow grower to 4 to 6 ft. tall and wide.** Full to part sun Zone 6



PYRACANTHA, YUKON BELLE

(LATIN: PYRACANTHA ANGUSTIFOLIA) An erect, spreading shrub with a dense branching habit. A profusion of white blooms in late spring are followed by orange berries. Excellent wildlife food. **Grows 6-10' tall with a 6-8' spread.** Part sun to shade Zone 4



QUINCE, SCARLET STORM

(LATIN: CHAENOMLES) Noted for producing an early spring bloom of double scarlet red flowers that resemble camellias. This is a dense, broad-rounded, thornless, deciduous shrub that **typically grows to 3-4' tall and as wide.** Spring blooms. Plants do not produce fruit. Oval to oblong, glossy dark green leaves. No fall color. Sun to part sun Zone 5-9



QUINCE, TEXAS SCARLET

(LATIN: CHAENOMLES SPECIOSA) It is a dense, broad-rounded, deciduous shrub with often-tangled, occasionally spiny-tipped twigs. **It typically grows to 3-4' tall and to 4-5' wide.** Single watermelon red flowers bloom, often in profusion, before the leaves fully unfold in an early spring bloom. Flowers are followed by hard, yellowish-green fruits that may acquire red tinges as they mature in autumn. No fall color. Full sun Zone 5-9



RHAMNUS, FINELINE

(LATIN: RHAMNUS FRANGULA ASPLENIFOLIA) Fantastic fern-like foliage gives this Buckthorn a unique texture. It has a narrow, upright habit and **grows 5-7 feet tall.** Use it to create narrow hedges or screens or as an accent specimen. Produces very little fruit. Full sun to part shade Zone 2



RHODO. LANDMARK

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Enjoy cheerful spring color from this compact mid-season bloomer that produces showy trusses of wavy-edged, deep fuchsia-pink flowers with a faint scarlet spotting. More sun tolerant than most, the small, dark green leaves turn bronze in the winter. Evergreen. **Moderate growing; reaches 4 ft. tall and wide.** Part sun Zone 5



RHODO. PJM ELITE

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) Full upright grower with glossy green foliage. This variety has a larger looser growth habit than Compact Briggs. **Grows 5' tall and wide.** Covered with large lavender-pink blossoms in early spring. Part sun Zone 4



RHODO. ROSEUM ELEGANS

(LATIN: RHODODENDRON) This selection is hardy to 25 degrees below zero with excellent heat tolerance. Produces a beautiful array of Rosy-lilac flowers in May against dense, smooth foliage. Acidic-soil loving broad-leaf evergreens. Plant in a location protected from strong winter winds. Roseum Elegans loves to be planted with pre-moistened peat moss, and well-drained soil. **The height on this is 6' tall and wide.** Sun to part shade Zone 5-8



SANDCHERRY, PAWN BUTTES

(LATIN: PRUNUS BESSEYI) A delightful, graceful, **groundcover only 18" tall and wide spreading to 4-6'**, it is a unique form of our western native sand cherry. Masses of fragrant, single white flowers in late-spring which give way to heavy crops of black cherries in summer that are useful to wildlife or jelly makers. Glossy deep-green leaves turn brilliant burgundy-red in autumn. Sun Zone 4



SANDCHERRY, PURPLE LEAF

(LATIN: PRUNUS X CISTENA) This tree form of the popular deciduous shrub has deep purple foliage. Has abundant white to pinkish-white flowers in early spring. **Grows 6 to 10 feet tall and 5 to 6 feet wide.** Ideal as a specimen. Full sun Zone 3



SMOKEBUSH, OLD FASH.

(LATIN: COTINUS COGGYGRIA) Deciduous shrub or tree, **growing to 10-12'** in many years, easy to keep smaller with pruning. Large, bluish green foliage emerges flushed pink and purple. Early summer bloom of pale smoky pink plumes. Fall colors are a blend of pink, orange and red. Sun or part shade Zone 5



SMOKEBUSH, WINE BLACK

(LATIN: COTINUS COGGYGRIA) Round rich purple leaves emerge in spring. With the heat of summer, leaves turn a deep near-black tone. Autumn brings a stunning array of reds and oranges. In early summer, you'll be enchanted by the large, soft panicles of the misty "smoke" of 'Winecraft Black'. Unlike other smokebush, it naturally has a rounded, dwarf habit which makes it the perfect addition to any sized yard. Deer resistant. **Grows 4-6' tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 4



SMOKE TREE, GRACE

(LATIN: COTINUS x GRACE) Foliage is intense wine-red when young, darkening to plum-red at maturity, then turning to a bright orange-red in the fall. Masses of deep pink flowers cover the robust shrub in the summer. **Averages 12 to 15 feet tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 4



SMOKE TREE, VELVETEENY

(LATIN: COTINUS COGGYGRIA) Velveteeny offers the same silky smooth, deep burgundy foliage with large feathery plumes of dove gray to pink blooms as it's big brother 'Royal Purple', but in a petit, dwarf form. **Maturing at a mere 3-4' with a similar spread,** Velveteeny is as versatile as it is exquisite, with its compact, rounded shape and brilliant color a dazzling addition to any sunny landscape. Full sun Zone 4-8



SNOWBERRY, CANDY

(LATIN: SYMPHORICARPOS X DOORENSII) This is a dwarf variety of the classic Snowberry bush. Vibrant green foliage on arching branches that explodes in elegant pink flowers throughout summer. As autumn approaches your blooms will merge into plump, pink berries. Winter brings a drop of the foliage, but the berries will remain to add decorative interest to your yard. **Grows 3-4 feet tall and wide.** Full to part sun Zone 4-8



SPIREA, ASH LEAF

(LATIN: *SORBARIA SORBIFOLIA*) Dwarf variety with appealing orange, yellow, and green foliage in spring and fall. Improved form of Sorbaria with better branching and a denser, compact habit. Panicles of white flowers in summer. **Grows 4-6 feet tall and wide.** Full sun Zone 4



SPIREA, BLUE KAZOO

(LATIN: *SPIRAEA MEDIA*) Cool blue foliage is the perfect contrast to this hardy plant's crisp white flowers blooming in spring. Hints of burgundy in the new growth foreshadow the rich red foliage color it develops in the fall. **Mounding habit, growing 2 to 3 feet tall and wide.** Sun Zone 4



SPIREA, DAKOTA GOLDCHARM (LATIN: *SPIRAEA JAPONICA*) Covered in stunning clusters of pink flowers at the ends of the branches from late spring to early summer. It has attractive gold foliage which emerges coppery-bronze in spring. The small serrated pointy leaves are highly ornamental and turn an outstanding coppery-bronze in the fall. It will **grow to 24 inches tall at maturity, with a spread of 3 feet.** Full sun Zone 3



SPIREA, DOUBLEPLAY ART.

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) Double Play Spireas have both colorful flowers and colorful foliage. Rich purple red new growth in spring complements deep pink summer flowers. Maintains its compact, mounded shape with very little pruning, and has more vivid color than other Spirea varieties. **Grows to 3 ft. tall and wide** Full sun Zone 4



SPIREA, DP BING BANG

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) With its dazzling display of colorful foliage and flowers, this fantastic selection provides beauty in the landscape from spring through fall! Emerging spring foliage glows orange, transitions to deep yellow all summer long, returning to rich golden orange in autumn. Massive pink flowers are the largest we've ever seen on a Spirea. **Grows to 3 ft. tall and wide** Full sun Zone 4



SPIREA, DP RED

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) Beautiful red covers this compact plant. Pure red flowers in spring are a perfect contrast to the foliage. **Matures at 2 to 4 feet tall and 2 to 3 feet wide.** Excellent for landscape plantings. Sun Zone 4



SPIREA, GOLDMOUND

(LATIN: SPIRAEA BUMALDA) A bushy plant with bright yellow foliage all summer. Clusters of light pink flowers in early summer. Outstanding accent plant for color or contrast in foundation planting. Reaches a **height of 3 feet with a spread of 3 to 4 feet.** Full to part sun Zone 4



SPIREA, LITTLE PRINCESS

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) Dwarf mounding shrub **growing to 2 feet tall and 3 feet wide.** Dainty clusters of pink blossoms in summer create quite a show against the mint green foliage. Excellent groundcover or dwarf specimen. A nice plant for small areas. Full sun Zone 4



SPIREA, MAGIC CARPET

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) This great introduction from England has smaller, more uniform compact growth habit **maturing at 18 to 24 inches tall and 24 inches wide.** The foliage is brighter, the flowers are darker pink and it is more resistant to mildews and leaf spot. Full to part sun Zone 4



SPIREA, NEON FLASH

(LATIN: SPIRAEA JAPONICA) A compact Spiraea cultivar that lights up the summer landscape with neon red flower clusters. The new leaves have a purplish tint as they emerge, then turn green and change to dark burgundy in fall. Grows **3 feet high and wide**. Full sun Zone 4



SPIREA, SNOWMOUND

An easy to grow shrub with graceful, spreading branches, dark green foliage, and an abundance of white flower clusters that provide a spectacular show in mid- to late spring. **Moderate growing, rounded form; reaches 3 to 5 ft. tall and wide**. Use at the back of the border or as a showy spring accent. Cut stems with blossoms create stunning flower arrangements. Deciduous. Full to part sun Zone 4-8



SPIREA, TOR

(LATIN: SPIRAEA BETULIFOLIA) The neat mound of rich green foliage provides the ideal backdrop for tight clusters of brilliant white flowers. Foliage becomes gold, red and purple in autumn. Fantastic planted in mass, lining a walkway or as a foundation plant. Deciduous. Compact, **rounded shrub 3 to 4 ft. tall and wide**. Full sun Zone 4



SPRUCE, DWARF ALBERTA

(LATIN: PICEA GLAUCA) A very slow growing, conical form, Spruce that matures at a **height of 5 to 7 feet and a width of 5 feet**. New foliage is bright green, changing slowly to bluish-green. Excellent accent or novelty evergreen plant. Great in containers. Full sun Zone 4



SPRUCE, GLOBE BLUE

(LATIN: PICEA PUNGENS) A true dwarf spruce with a low graft, provides an eye-catching specimen in the landscape. This compact spruce has bluish-white needles and a globe-shape habit **maturing at 3 foot high with a similar width**. Full to part sun Zone 2



SPRUCE, GLOBE BLUE STD.

(LATIN: PICEA PUNGENS) Globe Blue Spruce (tree form) **will grow to be about 6 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 5 feet**. It tends to be leggy, with a typical clearance of 3 feet from the ground, and should be under planted with lower-growing perennials. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 60 years or more. Full to part sun Zone 2



SPRUCE, PROCUMBENS

(LATIN: PICEA PUNGENS) A highly adaptable evergreen shrub with handsome silvery-blue foliage on a low undulating form. A perfect accent or ground cover to use among rockery or to spill over a wall. Tolerates harsh weather and needs little care or pruning to maintain shape. **Grows 6 to 12 in. per year; reaches 1 to 2 ft. tall, 5 to 8 ft. wide.** Full to part sun Zone 2-8



ST. JOHNS WORT, BL. VELVET

(LATIN: HYPERICUM) A sun-loving, mounding, and densely branched shrub with lustrous blue-green foliage. Bright, clear yellow flowers blanket this disease resistant plant in late spring. **Will grow 3- 4 feet tall with an equal spread.** Full sun Zone 4



ST. JOHNS, COBALT N GOLD

(LATIN: HYPERICUM) This mounded grower has silver-green foliage blanketed with ¾" sunny yellow flowers that are irresistible to butterflies in the late spring and early summer. This hardy specimen attains a **height of 2-3 feet tall and 4-5 feet wide.** The leaves transform themselves into yellow, orange and red in the fall. Full sun and well-drained soil. Full sun Zone 4-7



ST. JOHNS WORT, SUNBURST

(LATIN: HYPERICUM) Sunburst is a small, dense, upright, mounded deciduous shrub with attractive blue-green foliage. It has large, golden-

yellow flowers in mid-summer. Foliage may be semi-evergreen to evergreen in the southern part of its growing range. **Mature size is 3 to 4 feet tall and wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 5



ST. JOHNS, SUNNY BLVD

(LATIN: HYPERICUM) These flowers appear on a densely branched hybrid shrub with willow-like leaves. This shrub blooms from July until September with small, but numerous, rich yellow flowers and is tolerant of some drought but it will not tolerate any standing water. **Grows 2-3 feet tall and wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4-8



SUMAC, AUTUMN AMBER

(LATIN: RHUS TRILOBATA) In spring a profusion of small chartreuse-colored flowers bloom in clusters before new foliage appears. Shadowing the lovely blossoms are tiny, berry-like hairy fruits that can last into the winter season. In fall the leaves transform into striking hues of ambers, yellows, oranges and/or reds. With a compact, low-growing, spreading habit, it typically reaches **18 inches in height and 6 to 8 feet wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



SUMAC, GRO-LOW FRAG.

(LATIN: RHUS AROMATICA) Sparkling foliage and a low, wide-spreading habit make this fragrant sumac selection perfect for soil erosion control.

The plant reaches 2 feet tall and spreads rapidly up to 8 feet. It has small, yellow, aromatic flowers in the spring, followed by red hairy fruit. Fall foliage is orange to scarlet. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



SUMAC, SEPTEMBER BEAUTY (*LATIN: RHUS CHINENSIS*) Large growing background shrub or flat-topped small tree can fill an area as wide as tall. The large, bright green foliage can lend a tropical appearance to the landscape. Foliage turns shades of yellow, orange, and red in the fall. Masses of huge white paniced flowers appear in late August to early September, putting on a spectacular show. **Grows 15-25' tall with a 20-30' spread.** Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



SUMAC, SMOOTH (*LATIN: RHUS GLABRA*) A thicket-forming shrub or small tree with a spreading crown. Leaves alternate, feather-compound, central leaf-stem smooth, leaflets with tip pointed, base rounded, upper surface dark green, shiny; lower surface lighter to conspicuously white, smooth. Leaves turn red in fall. **Can grow up to 20 feet tall.** Full sun to part shade Zone 2-9



SUMAC, TIGER EYES

(LATIN: RHUS TYPHINA) The new growth is a vivid chartreuse green, changing to a bright yellow summer color. The leaf stems are purplish-pink and form a dramatic contrast with the lemon-lime foliage. A luminous combination of yellow, orange and intense scarlet is displayed in the fall. **Grows 3-6' tall and wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



SWEETSHRUB, HART. WINE

(LATIN: CALYCANTHUS RAULSTONII) Hartlage Wine is a deciduous shrub. A splendid new shrub notable for the large and showy wine-red flowers about 2.5 inches in diameter which appear over an extended period in spring and summer. Plant in fertile, well-drained soil in semi-shade. **Grows to the height of 10 feet tall and the spread of 8 feet wide.** Sun to part shade Zone 6-9



SWEETSHRUB, VENUS

(LATIN: CALYCANTHUS) Large, magnolia-like white flowers with yellow and purple central markings are delightfully fragrant in early summer and appear intermittently thru the season. Glossy green foliage matures to a golden yellow in autumn. **Reaches 5 feet tall and 5 feet wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 5-8



TRUMPET VINE, SUM. JAZZ

(LATIN: CAMPSIS) The Summer Jazz series are compact and tame. Summer Jazz™ Gold has showy yellow blooms late summer to early fall on a moderate climber **reaching 3 feet tall and wide**. Full sun Zone 5



TRUMPET VINE, IND. SUM.

(LATIN: CAMPSIS RADICANS) Produces clusters of orange-red trumpet-shaped flowers to 3" long from late spring into early summer. Each flower is yellowish orange with a reddish throat. Reaches up to 15' tall with a 5' spread. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



TRUMP. VINE, MADAM GAL.

(LATIN: CAMPSIS x TAGLIABUANA) It produces trumpet-shaped, cantaloupe-orange to salmon-red flowers which appear in loose clusters throughout the summer. It is a woody, clinging vine which attaches itself to structures and climbs by aerial rootlets. It rapidly **grows 15-25' high with a 12' spread**. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



WEIGELA, BURGANDY FIRE

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) Mounded and upright: Fuchsia colored flowers: Green foliage turns bronze to red with cool temperatures.

Grows to the height of 4 feet tall and 4 feet wide. Full sun Zone 5



WEIGELA, CZECHMARK TRIL

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) This Weigela has a beautiful set of white, pink and red blooms all on one plant in spring. The foliage is glossy and green, and is showy all season long. **Reaches 36 to 42 inches tall and wide.** Excellent in mixed borders. Sun Zone 4



WEIGELA, FINE WINE

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) This vastly improved weigela selection has a tight and upright form without the tendency to fall open from the center. **Reaches 2 to 4 ft. tall, up to 3 ft. wide.** Rich, dark foliage color is similar in color to that of fine burgundy wine, providing vibrant contrast to the deep pink spring flowers. A slight shearing will encourage re-bloom through the summer. Part to full sun Zone 4



WEIGELA, MAROON SWOON

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) Maroon Swoon is a weigela that really brings the drama with its deep red blooms and attractive green foliage that come together to present a complete package of ardent fire. Can grow to the height of 4-5' with a spread of 3-4'. This weigela boasts bold, crimson trumpet shaped blooms contrasted with hardy green foliage. Part to full sun Zone 4



WEIGELA, SONIC BLOOM

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) Create an explosion of color with this fantastic new re-blooming selection. Loads of hot pink flowers in spring are followed by waves of blooms until frost! Mounded growth habit with deep green, deer resistant foliage. Reblooms without deadheading, providing season-long color in foundation plantings and borders. Attracts hummingbirds. Deciduous. **Reaches 4 to 5 ft. tall and wide.** Partial to full sun Zone 5-8



WEIGELA, SPILLED WINE

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) This small plant packs a punch with its dark, black-purple, wavy foliage. Bright magenta-pink flowers pop against the dark leaves. Full sun allows for the best foliage color. This deciduous shrub **grows 2 to 3 feet tall and 3 to 4 feet wide.** Sun Zone 4



WEIGELA, WINE AND ROSES

(LATIN: WEIGELA FLORIDA) This weigela cultivar is a densely-rounded deciduous shrub which typically grows **4-5' tall** with a slightly larger

spread. It is primarily grown for its profuse reddish-pink spring flowers and its purple foliage. Elliptic to obovate, glossy, burgundy-purple leaves turn very dark purple in autumn. Full sun Zone 4



WISTERIA, AUNT DEE

(LATIN: WISTERIA MACHROSTACHYA) A proven hardy selection graced with 8 to 12 in. long clusters of lilac blue flowers. Superb for covering a trellis, pillar, fence, rail or arbor. **Twining stems 15 to 25 ft. long.** Tolerates wet soils better and more restrained than Asian Wisterias. Native to the southeast U.S. Deciduous. Full sun Zone 4



WISTERIA, BLUE MOON

(LATIN: WISTERIA MACHROSTACHYA) Dependably blooms up to three times in a growing season once established, producing beautiful, fragrant, pea-like lavender-blue flowers. **Twining stems 15 to 25 ft. long.** Ideal for arching over gateways and entries or along the top of a wall. Deciduous. Full sun Zone 4



WISTERIA, LAWRENCE

(LATIN: FLORIBUNDA) Lawrence Wisteria is covered in stunning chains of fragrant sky blue pea-like flowers with a white flare dangling from the stems from early to mid-spring. It has green foliage which emerges coppery-bronze in spring. The narrow pinnately compound leaves turn yellow in fall. **Can grow to 30' tall with a 2' spread.** Full sun Zone 6



WITCHHAZEL, ANGELLY

(LATIN: HAMAMELIS X INTERMEDIA) A vigorous, upright spreading shrub. Come February branches are covered with small clusters of pale yellow, long-petaled blooms that are slightly fragrant. Good yellow fall color. **Grows to 13' tall with a 13' spread.** Full sun Zone 5



WITCHHAZEL, AUT. EMBERS

(LATIN: HAMAMELIS VERNALIS) Typically matures as a spreading shrub **to 8-10' tall with a slightly smaller spread.** Showy, fragrant, copper-red flowers in axillary clusters bloom along the bare stems in mid- to late winter. Rounded leaves emerge light green in spring, but quickly mature to medium green. Fall color typically includes an excellent combination of yellows, oranges and reds which purportedly resemble the embers of a glowing campfire. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



WITCHHAZEL, BARMSTET GLD (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS X INTERMEDIA*) Barmstedt Gold is a yellow-flowered form with upright-spreading branching. **It will typically grow to 9-12' tall and to 9-12' wide.** It is noted for its winter-blooming, golden yellow flowers. Each flower has four, narrow, ribbon-like, curled and slightly crinkled petals. Clusters of these flowers bloom along the stems from late January to March. Dark green leaves turn attractive yellow in fall. Full sun to part shade Zone 4-8



WITCHHAZEL, CARMINE RED (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS X INTERMEDIA*) Carmine Red is a large, spreading, deciduous shrub with broadly oval, glossy, dark green leaves turning yellow and orange in autumn. Lightly fragrant, red to reddish-pink flowers with twisted, crimped petals bloom in winter. This rather large **shrub will grow 15-18' tall.** Full to part sun Zone 6



WITCHHAZEL, GRAPE FIZZ (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS*) Has abundant flowers with reddish grape-purple strap-like petals and yellow stamens in early spring. Its foliage turns golden yellow in fall. It has a bushy habit and **grows 4 to 5 ft. tall and wide.** Full sun to part shade Zone 4



WITCHHAZEL, JELENA (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS X INTERMEDIA*) Jelena is an upright cultivar with ascending branches and a spreading habit. It will typically **grow slowly**

to 8-12' tall, and is noted for its winter-blooming, sweetly fragrant, copper flowers, each having four narrow, ribbon-like, crinkly petals. Axillary clusters of these flowers bloom along the stems in February to March. Broad-oval, green leaves. Orange-red fall color is usually quite attractive. Full to part sun Zone 5-8



WITCHHAZEL, KOHANKIE RED (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS VERNALIS*) Kohankie Red features red flowers. It typically grows to 7-9' tall and to 8-10' wide. Showy flowers bloom in axillary clusters along bare stems from late January to March. Calyx is purple-red. Flowers have a strong fragrance. Oblong leaves emerge with purple tints in spring, mature to dark green and finally turn yellow-aging-to-red in fall. Full sun to part shade Zone 4



WITCHHAZEL, STRWB. CREAM (*LATIN: HAMAMELIS X INTERMEDIA*) Strawberries and Cream typically matures as a spreading shrub to 9-11' tall and as wide. Showy, mildly fragrant, bicolor flowers in clusters bloom along the bare stems in mid-to late winter. Each flower has four, narrow, ribbon-like, curled and crinkled petals that are yellow at the tip transitioning to red at the base. Rounded leaves emerge with bronze tones in spring, but mature to green before finally changing to a quality yellow in fall. Full sun to part shade Zone 5



WITCHHAZEL, VERNAL

(LATIN: HAMAMELIS VERNALIS) Vernal Witch Hazel is a winter-blooming, ornamental shrub. It has an extremely early (January-March), and lengthy bloom period. New growth brings additional color as leaves emerge a glorious bronze-red. Vernal Witch Hazel is a deciduous shrub with a rounded habit. It typically **grows 6-10' tall with a somewhat larger spread.** Full sun to full shade Zone 5-8



WITCHHAZEL, WISE SUPREME (LATIN: HAMAMELIS MOLLIS) A large, rounded shrub which brings color and fragrance to the late winter garden when most other plants are still dormant; fragrant golden yellow flowers appear along the bare branches; leaves emerge yellow-green, mature to green, then yellow fall color. It will **grow to be about 12 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 10 feet.** Sun to shade Zone 4



YEW, CAPTAIN

(LATIN: TAXUS CUSPIDATA) An excellent hedge or topiary evergreen with emerald green new growth in spring that contrasts well against the dark green needles, upright habit of growth is slower and more restrained than the popular Capitata; takes pruning very well, tolerates shade. **Grows 12' tall with a spread of 6'.** Sun to shade Zone 4



YEW, DENSI

(LATIN: TAXUS DENSIFORMUS) The most versatile and popular Yew. It has a low-growing, wide-spreading habit with a very dense center and dark green needles. Excellent for foundation plantings and as a specimen plant. **Reaches 3 to 5 feet tall and 6 to 8 feet wide.** Full sun to full shade Zone 4



YEW, EVERLOW

(LATIN: TAXUS X MEDIA) Does well in colder climates; has deep green needles and low spreading makes it handle wind dissection extremely well. Bud scales are blunt and leaves are two-ranked. **Grows 2 to 3 feet tall and 4 to 5 feet wide.** Sun to part shade Zone 4



YEW, HICKSII

(LATIN: TAXUS X MEDIA) An upright, almost columnar growing Yew that is extremely hardy in the north. Deep green needles densely cover the plant which produces bright red berries in the fall. This slow grower **reaches 10 to 12 feet tall by 3 to 4 feet wide.** Sun to part shade Zone 4



YEW, UPRIGHT EDDIE

(LATIN: TAXUS X MEDIA) Columnar evergreen shrub with short dark green needle like foliage. A male selection very similar to Hicks in form and color but will not produce berries. Useful as hedge that takes well to shearing. **Slow growing, 15-20' tall.** Does best with protection from afternoon and winter sun. Shade Zone 4



YEW, WARDII

(LATIN: TAXUS X MEDIA) Wardii is a low-growing, wide-spreading cultivar with a flattened top that features pointed, linear, dark green needle-like leaves that are attractive year round. **It typically grows slowly to 4' tall and spreads to 8' wide** over the first 10 years, but may over time eventually reach 6' tall by 20' wide. Full sun to part shade Zone 4
